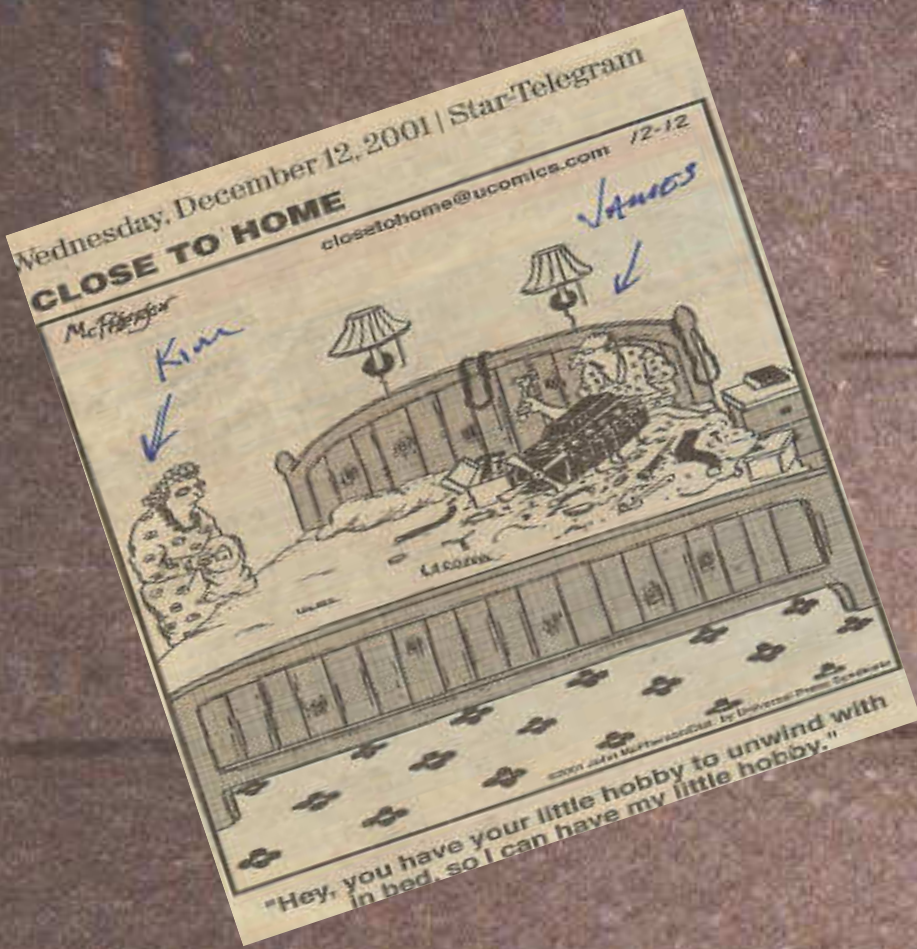

# BY - LAWS & STANDING RULES POLICIES & PROCEDURES

The following changes are recommended for your approval by the Elected Officers and the Parliamentarian and By-Laws Committee. Each will be voted on at the Membership Meeting on September 7, 2007. A two-thirds (2/3) vote of the membership present at the meeting is required for By-Laws changes. A majority vote of the membership present at the meeting is required for Standing Rules, Policies & Procedures changes.

Your vote counts!  
Please come prepared.

The following changes to the **STANDING RULES, POLICIES & PROCEDURES** will be **effective immediately upon approval by the membership:**



**Section 15, In the event of hospitalization...**

#### Current reading:

In the event of hospitalization for surgery or illness, flowers will be sent only to the Club member, Spouse/Companion, or child of the member. In case of a death of a Club member, Spouse/Companion, child or Club member's parents, flowers will be sent. A memorial donation may be substituted for flowers.

#### Proposed reading:

Sentiments will be sent to a Club member, in the form of flowers or an appropriate personalized item, in the event of surgery or hospitalization for illness of a Club member, or his/her Spouse/Companion, or dependent child. In case of death of a Club member, his/her Spouse/Companion, dependent child or par-

ent, flowers or a memorial donation will be sent.

**The following changes to the By-Laws will be effective immediately upon approval by the membership:**

**By-Laws ARTICLE III, Section 3.14 SPONSOR:**

#### Current reading:

This chairperson shall be the contact between our Sponsor(s) and the Club. He/she will develop a working relationship that benefits both parties by getting feedback from members and the Sponsor's contact person. He/she will promote mutual benefits, negotiate all dealings, handle correspondence, be present at all meetings with the Sponsor, and keep the contact person informed of Club meetings and events.

#### Proposed reading:

##### **3.14 SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM**

This committee is responsible for securing Sponsors and management of the Sponsorship Program as approved by the Board. This Chairperson shall maintain accurate records, promote and report program progress to the Board and the membership, secure Board approval of designated Sponsors, submit a report to the Board of new and prospective Sponsors on a monthly basis and follow financial procedures as directed by the Board and these By-Laws. This committee shall oversee compliance to the Board approved Sponsorship Program Guidelines, assisting and guiding the various other Chairpersons and Elected Officers as needed.

**By-Laws ARTICLE V, Section 5.0 NOMINATION OF ELECTED OFFICERS**

#### Current Reading:

Nominations for NCCC Governor will

be conducted by open nominations from the floor at the September monthly membership meeting only. Nominations for all other Elected Officers will be by written nomination at the October monthly membership meeting. The Secretary will canvass the nominees, and will present a proposed ballot of the qualified candidates to the membership at the November monthly membership meeting, where any additional nominations will be accepted from the floor.

#### Propose reading:

The Secretary (or a designee appointed by the President) must secure confirmation from any qualified nominee for an Elected Officer position prior to the close of nominations.

Nominations for NCCC Governor will be conducted by open nominations from the floor at the September monthly membership meeting only.

Nominations for Elected Officers, other than NCCC Governor, will be by a nominating ballot cast at the October monthly membership meeting. The Secretary will present the nominating ballot of the qualified candidates to the membership at the November monthly membership meeting, at which time additional nominations will be taken from the floor.

Nominations for the election of an officer to serve an interim term will be by open nominations from the floor at the monthly membership meeting following the month the resignation was announced at a membership meeting.

**By-Laws ARTICLE V, Section 6.0 ELECTION OF OFFICERS**

#### Current reading:

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

The Secretary will present a ballot of qualified candidates to the

membership. The election of NCCC Governor will be held at the October monthly membership meeting. The election of all other Elected Officers will be held at the December Annual Membership Meeting.

If only one candidate has been nominated for an office, the President will declare the nominee elected.

When conducting elections of officers, the Secretary will present a ballot of qualified candidates for distribution to all Club members in The Cowtown Low-Down and a facsimile on the Club website the month prior to election of officers. The completed ballot must be returned to the Secretary (or a designee as instructed in the ballot) either by mail, electronic mail or in person at the next membership meeting. Only one completed ballot per member will be accepted. The ballot must be received by the Secretary prior to the counting of the votes at the next membership meeting. When a majority vote is not obtained or in case of a tie, a secondary or run-off ballot will be distributed to the members present at the membership meeting at which the votes have been counted. All votes from the membership will be counted by at least two (2) Club members, who are not on the ballot. The nominee attaining a majority will be the winner

6.1 The Secretary will present a ballot of qualified candidates to the membership. The election of NCCC Governor will be held at the October monthly membership meeting. The election of other Elected Officers will be held at the December Annual Membership Meeting. The election of an officer to serve an interim term will take place the membership meeting after the nominations, unless it is un-contested (single nomination).

6.2 If only one candidate has been nominated for an office, the President will declare the nominee elected.

When conducting elections of officers, the Secretary (or a designee appointed by the President) will oversee the mailing of the official election ballots, postmarked no later than two (2) weeks prior to the election, to the current official roll of voting members. The election ballot shall serve as official notice of an election. The Club newsletter and website shall serve as a resource for information concerning the election. The completed election ballot must be mailed to the Club Post Office Box as instructed in the ballot or submitted in person at the next membership meeting, prior to the beginning of the counting of the votes, to be valid. Only one completed ballot per member will be accepted. When a majority vote is not obtained or in case of a tie, a secondary or run-off ballot will be distributed to the members present at the membership meeting at which the votes have been counted. All votes from the membership will be counted by at least two (2) Club members, who are not on the ballot. The nominee attaining a majority will be

elected or in the specific case of voting for multiple open Board Member positions, the ballot will contain instructions so that the nominees with the most votes will be elected to fill the available positions.

## **By-Laws ARTICLE V, Section 7.0 RESIGNATION OF ELECTED OFFICERS**

### Current reading:

In the event any Elected Officer, except the President should resign or become unable to perform the functions of that office, the President will appoint a member to perform the duties of that office until a special election can be held per 6.0 ELECTION OF OFFICERS. The nominations would be accepted during the first membership meeting following the resignation, with the Membership voting (via secret ballot) to take place the membership meeting after that, unless it is un-contested (single nomination). The nominee with a majority vote will then complete the term of the office left open by the resignation.

In the absence, death, resignation, or inability of the President to perform his/her duties, the duties usually pertaining to the office will be performed by the Vice President until an election can be held per 6.0 ELECTION OF OFFICERS. If the Vice President is unable to perform the duties of President, the chain of command will follow the order of leadership as outlined in ARTICLE V, Section 1.0 ELECTED OFFICERS.

### Proposed reading:

In the event any Elected Officer, except the President should resign or become unable to perform the functions of that office, the President will appoint a member to perform the duties of that office until a special election can be held per 5.0 NOMINATION OF ELECTED OFFICERS and 6.0 ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

In the absence, death, resignation, or inability of the President to perform his/her duties, the duties usually per-

## By-Laws ARTICLE VI, 3.0 DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY

### Current reading:

The Secretary will attend all meetings of the members and the Elected Officers, record all minutes and notes in a book kept for this purpose, and prepare the minutes to be published in the newsletter. The Secretary shall retain tapes from all Club meetings for a minimum of two (2) years. The Secretary will give all notices of meetings of the members and will provide ballots for all officer elections. Per 6.3 of ELECTION OF OFFICERS, at the October membership meeting, the Secretary will provide a preliminary ballot to be used by the members to nominate Elected Officers for the following year. Upon the return of the preliminary ballots, the Secretary will canvass the nominees for acceptance prior to presenting the ballot to the members at the November membership meeting. After additional nominations have been taken from the floor at the November membership meeting, Secretary will prepare the Official Ballot for distribution in The Cowtown Low-Down and a facsimile on the Club website. The Secretary will be responsible for ordering flowers in the case of illness or death. The Secretary will perform all other duties pertaining to this office.

In the absence of the Secretary, the presiding officer will appoint a Secretary Pro Tempore to record the minutes of the meeting.

### Proposed reading:

The Secretary will attend all meetings of the members and the Elected Officers, record all minutes and notes in a book kept for this purpose, and prepare the minutes to be published in

the newsletter. The Secretary shall retain tapes from all Club meetings for a minimum of two (2) years. The Secretary will give all notices of meetings of the members and will complete his/her duties relating to ARTICLE V, 5.0 NOMINATIONS OF ELECTED OFFICERS and 6.0 ELECTION OF OFFICERS. The Secretary will submit a slate for the Election of Officers to the Club newsletter and website. The Secretary will be responsible for extending appropriate sentiments on behalf of the Club as outlined in the Standing Rules, Policies and Procedures. The Secretary will perform all other duties pertaining to this office.

In the absence of the Secretary, the presiding officer will appoint a Secretary Pro Tempore to record the minutes of the meeting.

## **By-Laws ARTICLE VI, Section 2.0 DUTIES OF THE VICE PRESIDENT**

The word "Chairman" in the second sentence is to be replaced by the word "Chairperson."

## **The following changes to the STANDING RULES, POLICIES & PROCEDURES and By-Laws will be effective January 1, 2008, upon approval by the membership:**

### **Section 2, A 100%er AWARD...**

#### Current reading of only sentence one (1) to be proposed for change:

A 100%er AWARD is presented annually to each couple or single who attends at least 11 of 12 monthly membership meetings and a Club event at least 9 of 10 months, February through November.

#### Proposed reading:

A 100%er AWARD is presented annually to each couple or single who attends at least 10 of 11 monthly membership meetings, January through November, and an eligible Club event at least 10 of 11 months, January through November.

## **By-Laws ARTICLE VII, Section 3.0 DUTIES OF COMMITTEES, Subsection 3.13 SOCIAL:**

#### Current reading of only sentence one (1) affected by the proposed change

to the 100%er Award, if approved as written above:

This committee shall be responsible for coordinating at least, but not limited to one (1) 100%er social event per month from February thru November.

#### Proposed reading change to this first sentence only:

This committee shall be responsible for coordinating at least, but not limited to one (1) 100%er social event from January thru November

## **Standing Rules, Policies & Procedures, Section 6, AN OUTSTANDING MALE/OUTSTANDING FEMALE...**

### Current reading:

AN OUTSTANDING MALE/OUTSTANDING FEMALE Member award\*\* is presented annually to the male and female that are considered to have helped the Club and been very active during that year. It is not a popularity contest. Balloting for this award is done three times a year: at the April, August, and December monthly membership meetings. Votes are taken by secret ballot. The awards are presented at an Awards Banquet. These members will be refunded their Primary Club membership dues for the following year.

#### Proposed reading change to this third (3<sup>rd</sup>) sentence only:

Balloting for this award is done three times a year: at the April, July and November monthly membership meetings.
