

COMPETITION



The 2007 Competition year has ended for the Cowtown Programs, offering competitors a small break before they start up again next year.

Regardless of your passion and how you enjoy your Vette, Cowtown does have something for you. For this

month, I have focused my last article on listing some of these venues waiting for your participation.

Annual Awards - all of the venues listed below recognize the top participants of each of these venues.

100%er - for all those that like to socialize and participate in the club meetings and monthly socials.

Car Show - for those of you that really enjoy showing their Vette.

Cruiser - for those of you that like to cruise and/or take trips in their Vette, either alone or as a group.

Outstanding Male / Female - You, the Cowtown membership have an opportunity to select one male and female each year for their outstanding efforts for Cowtown.

National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) - there are three types of NCCC awards presented: 1) National, 2) Regional (southwest region [SWR]) and 3) Cowtown. All of these are YTD points venues; for all types of events.

The SWR and National points are accumulated for each type NCCC event you participate in, which also accumulates into your Cowtown YTD points.

The Top 15 National Awards are presented at the NCCC National Convention each year. For SWR NCCC Awards, only the SWR Events count; these awards are presented each spring at the annual SWR NCCC Awards Banquet. The Club NCCC Awards are presented at the Cowtown annual Holiday Party & Awards Banquet; held in December each year.

Car Show / Concours* - these are either judged or people's choice style events.

Drag Racing* - can be any combination of matching time, elapsed time (ET) and record drags.

Funkhana* - typically a driving type event which has gimmicks or stations where the participants are required to get out of their Vette; completing the task before proceeding on to the next station.

Overall Top Competitor - the CTV member that accumulates the most NCCC points in the competition year will be awarded this perpetual award.

Rallyes* - these are driver / navigator skill type driving events where you must follow instructions and/or perform gimmicks to complete the event.

Rookie of the Year* - The first full year of your NCCC membership, you are eligible to participate.

Speed Events* - these driving ET Type skill events (such as autocross) which include both high and low speed venues. These are not wheel-to-wheel events.

NCCC does have other type events but we typically do not see them in the SWR - check your rule book.

* = awards available at the SWR and Club level

** = awards also at the national level

Open Road Racing (ORR) - A points program for those that have a need for sustained & timed speed.

Rookie of the Year - like the SWR NCCC ROY program however, this is awarded to the Cowtown member accumulating the most points representing Cowtown.

Other Awards - beyond the above listing, the President, NCCC Governor and Charities Chairperson have the option of presenting an award to the person that they feel was outstanding to them and their efforts.

If you have any questions on these competition venues, more information can be found on our website, our By-Laws & Standing Rules or you can contact either myself or the Chairperson for that specific venue.

year (mostly for 2008 Convention planning). This meeting was in Texas City on October 27.

Bob Pattillo, the SW Region Regional Competition Director, suggested that the most prudent option is to approve the new competition [section of the] rulebook. The copy presented to the Governors contains typos and other errors. Bob believes that the best course of action is to approve it as is and correct the errors. The Governors recommended to Bernyce Molenda, our Regional Executive, to cast our proxies in favor of the revised 2008 rulebook.

During our discussion of the proposed 2008 rulebook were a few items that may be of interest. The new rules do away with the date requirements for after market seat belts and harnesses. [Scott's note: this is ridiculous.] Under the new rules, polyurethane [after market] bushings will be legal in all classes. And, Group I cars can now remove the spare tire. [Scott's note: Another way of saying this last item is Group I cars can no longer bump into Group II by simply removing the spare tire.] More on the rulebook later.

The 2007 Southwest Region Awards Banquet will be hosted by Longhorn Corvette Club in Austin. The date will be March 16. We will also be celebrating LCC's 35th anniversary.

Bernyce Molenda, our newly elected RE, announced her appointments. They are Ken Sutton (CenTex CC), treasurer; Mary Anne Kolb (THT), scholarship director; and Eileen Fox (Tejas Vettes) continuing as secretary. [Since the meeting, Doug McMahan (CTV) has been appointed as regional Webmaster.]

The most important point of our discussion

The NCCC Southwest Region held an extra meeting this

about the 2008 Convention in Tulsa, to me at least, was that a beverage chairperson has been appointed.

Miscellaneous Nuggets - The 2008 rule book was approved at the November National Governors' Meeting. There is still some squabbling over clerical changes (typos). The plan is to have the new rule book distributed on a compact disc and on the national NCCC Website (for download). Note that there is no schedule for this (as of this writing). I can provide you with an advanced copy which could be helpful if you are doing some off-season car preparation.


The result of the national vote for the 2009 NCCC Convention site is Colorado Springs CO (besting Grand Rapids MI).

I have tabulated the 2007 NCCC competition points for the CTV competitor awards which will be presented at the CTV Christmas Party and Awards Banquet.

Membership Renewals - I have submitted our NCCC renewals to the Regional Membership Director. If you did not get your renewal to me, you may do so before December 31 to avoid being dropped from the membership roll. It's \$72/couple, \$52/single, plus \$10 for each NCCC dependent member. These fees include both Cowtown and NCCC membership.

Remember - NCCC 2008 National Convention clothing and logo merchandise are available from Don Wells. He has exclusive colors for Southwest Region members (since we're the hosts) at bargain prices. Look sharp for Tulsa in June 2008.

The TMS Schedule for 2008 practices, qualification, and races are: **Spring, April 3-6** (Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday) includes Nationwide Series (formerly Busch Series) O'Reilly 300; and Sprint Cup (formerly NEXTEL Cup) Samsung 500. **Summer, June 5-7** (Thursday, Friday, and Saturday) includes Craftsman Truck Sam's Town 400; and Indy Racing League Bombardier Learjet 550. **Fall, October 30, 31, and November 1, 2** (Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday) Craftsman Truck Chevy Silverado 350; O'Reilly Challenge, and Sprint Cup Dickies 500.

Cowtown Vettes members who desire to work, but did not work this year, please contact me to provide the following information: name, phone number (preferable cell), email and dates and times available to work. To enhance your selection to work, it is best if you can work Thursday and Friday, as well as Saturday and Sunday (as applicable). Normally, Thursday has less activity scheduled which allows us to provide the training necessary to be a viable asset for practices, qualifications, and races on the other days. North Upper and Lower Pit Road, including Victory Lane, or Area 4 is our primary work area. However, due to our experience level, we are called upon often to temporarily work in other areas adjacent to the pits including the Sprint Garage, Nationwide Garage, and Media Center. These areas may also have permanent worker openings. John Breczynski enjoyed working in the Busch (now Nationwide) Garage and may choose to work there permanently. This worker availability listing will be presented in January to TMS Operations, Security Department, to give us priority over those applying at the work fair.





(Cover story from page 1) The first NCCC convention we went to was in Colorado Springs in 1979. We towed a '66 Vette with a '73 Vette, a pretty funny sight going through the mountains. We got to know the Lindseys, Hoaldriged and Forsythes pretty well on that trip and we all have remained good friends over the years. To show how dedicated some of us were, Debbie was pregnant with her and Jerry's first son, Colin. We were in Pueblo, Colorado in 100+ temperatures and Debbie swelled up like a balloon. It was pretty scary but she stuck it out and all went well when we got out of the heat. We weren't racing, only spectating at that time. In 1981, the Lindseys and us traveled all over the country to NCCC events chasing those coveted points. It paid off because that year Cowtown was Number One in the nation, Jerry and Debbie were Number One in Men's and Ladies' and Don and I were Number Two. We had a lot of fun racing that year and met a lot of nice Corvette people in other parts of the country.

Gradually, racing and raising a family started to compete with each other. My son, Jacen, really never had much of an interest in cars although we dragged him along to many NCCC events. I think after he saw me do a 360 on the drag strip at Little River, he definitely decided racing was not for him and didn't want me doing it either! Greg, on the other hand, grew up with us and the Lindsey's boys, out on the road going from one event to another. We got Greg (or he got himself) into racing go-carts at the

age of 10, where he competed with other kids in the North Texas Karting club. As he got older it was a fairly easy transition to the big cars. He has raced in several autocrosses and given Don a run for his money. He's beaten him a few times, much to Don's chagrin!

Over the years we have owned 12 Vettes, a '58, '66, '70, '71, 3 '73s, '77, '91, '95, and 2 '96s. Nine of them have left our stable for greener pastures. OPEN ROAD RACING

I can't believe it is already nearing the end of 2007 and time for the year-end trophies in Open Road Racing. The rules for trophies this year will be as follows:

Trophies will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place based on total points for the year. Racers/teams earn points for getting a trophy in a race, for low time errors, and for race attendance according to the table below. Points are deducted for being disqualified (DQ) from the race. Ties in points for the year end trophy will be decided by number of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place trophy finishes during the year.

Race Criteria	Points
1 st Place Trophy	10
2 nd Place Trophy	9
3 rd Place Trophy	8
>= 0.00 and <= 0.5 second time error	7
> 0.5 and <= 1.0 second time error	6
> 1.0 and <= 1.5 second time error	5
> 1.5 and <= 2.0 second time error	4
Attendance	3
DQ	-3

There will be a Navigator of the Year trophy given to the navigator with the least time error in any single race. This trophy is for a person who navigates only, solo drivers and co-driver/co-navigator teams cannot be considered for the navigator trophy.

There will be a roaming joke DQ trophy given to the racer/team with the most DQ's for the year. The unfortunate racer/team that gets this trophy will have to keep it until the next year and then give it up to the next recipient.

The trophies will be presented at the CTV awards banquet so be sure to attend for the results otherwise look for the CTV year end ORR results in the January newsletter.

Remember first ORR race for 2008 is Big Bend ORR April 23 – 26, 2008 visit www.bborr.com for more information.
