OPEN ROAD RACING

Here is a quick recap of last year's CTV Open Road Race year-end results:

- 1st Place Karl and Audrey Samuel Total points: 37
- 2nd Place Steve Gilland Total points: 18
- 3rd Place David and Lauri Robbins Total points: 3
- Navigator of the Year Audrey Samuel Best time error: 0.197 seconds

What the heck is Open Road Racing you ask? Well, it is a timed precision rally style race that requires good reaction times for starting and stopping a stop watch, good driving skills, and some math skill to calculate speed from time and distance

measurements. It is not wheel-to-wheel racing. It is considered a high speed event by any race event measure. The object of the race is to try and accurately average a "target speed" without exceeding a maximum speed, known as a "tech speed," over a closed road course of 80 to 120 miles. The course is not a straight roadway but has corners of varying difficulty, as well as elevation changes. It is about precision and an error greater than 0.1MPH from the target speed is usually not good enough to win a trophy.

The "target speed" you choose depends on your driving experience, safety equipment in the car, and personal safety equipment. The faster your "target speed" the more safety equipment that is required. Absolute minimum safety equipment is a fire extinguisher mounted in the car and a helmet. The target speed classes in the Big Bend Open Road Race start at 85MPH and for the majority of cars end at 150MPH. However, do not think that just because you have had your car up to greater than 100MPH on the freeway for a short distance (Shame on you for do-ing it.) that you can easily average those high speeds for a long distance negotiating corners as is required in this race. Trust me, it ain't even close to a quick jaunt to a high speed on the freeway.

The first ORR race for 2008 is Big Bend ORR April 23–26, 2008. Visit <u>www.bborr.com</u> for more information. This race usually sells out, so you need to get your entry forms sent in at least one month before the race, if not sooner, to guarantee entry. You can download and print out the entry forms from the website, as well as the complete rules for the race.

If you think there is even a slight chance you will go, I strongly urge you to get hotel reservations NOW, because all the hotel rooms in Ft. Stockton are booked on a regular basis by all the oil workers in town for the oil boom due to high oil prices. Hotels and phone numbers are also listed on the website.
