Right now, here I go again, trying to remember back 48 years. Do you realize just how hard that can be on one's brain!! Okay, here it is...

My first look at a Corvette was back in my high school year of 1954-1955. I saw a white Corvette parked out in the school parking lot for students. I knew the girl who was driving the vehicle, since she was my brother's girlfriend at the time. All I ever heard was that Carol Cooper DID NOT like that car as her car-pooling vehicle when it was her time to drive it for a group of friends. Her Dad was always giving a new General Motors vehicle each year, because his name was Jack Cooper of Cooper Transportation Company. He had a fleet of those big long trucks that carried General Motors cars all over the United States. That year he was given this white Corvette. He was a big man and thought that his daughter would enjoy it, since it was considered a sports car. Unfortunately, she didn't. To hear her talk about it, it wasn't worth shooting; it hardly would make the complete round trip from home to school. Finally, her Dad asked General Motors for another vehicle, which I believe was a Cadillac for the replacement. My brother dating her must have been a good choice, because on December 22, 2007, they celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary and they now have five grown children.

When I got married in August 1960, neither of us had a car of our own. Jim's Dad had just passed away and his Mom said that we could drive his Dad's car until wintertime. So, one Friday night while on our way to visit the family, we decided to stop at the Chevrolet dealership that was right on the corner where we would normally turn to see what they had to offer. When the salesman asked us what we had in mind, we both casually wanted to know all about the 1961 Corvette that was parked over in a corner by a Christmas tree. He didn't take us seriously and suggested a Corvair, saying that the payments would only be half of what a Corvette would be. We still just wanted to know about the Corvette. He then realized that we were serious about the Corvette and we started talking about what all was necessary for this to take place. To make a long story short, we put down \$1,000 as a down payment

and \$110.00 for 36 months. That was the cost of the Corvette. It first listed out at \$4,800, but when we got him down to around \$4,200, the deal was set. We picked up the Corvette the next morning, Saturday, December 10, 1960. At the time, I had only driven a stick shift on the column, so it was a true adventure to learn how to change gears from the floor, and it had four gears, too. Just another thing to learn about the vehicle...

The name of the Corvette came from the salesperson, because he kept saying, "low down payment and we will let you have her..." The name stuck for her. It wasn't until we moved to Fort Worth in the Fall of 1964 that we found out that you could actually get a personalized license plate, costing about \$10 extra at that time!! From January 1961 until the Fall of 1964, we were members of the Kansas City Corvette Club. We had one small child at that time. I would put his little padded seat that was given to him when he was born between the car seats. At that time, there were no laws about child car seats; in fact, the Corvette didn't even come with lap seat belts. Somehow or another, we managed to drive the Corvette, even with two small boys with us, and didn't get a second vehicle until 1966. Guess what...it was a used Spider Corvair... ha-ha! One day in 1974, my husband ran into Dennis McPeak at the Chevrolet Dealership. Both were looking for some parts and started talking. Dennis told us about Cowtown Vettes. In fact, he was its first Club President when we joined in December 1974. Jerry Lindsey had just been elected President and we slowly started coming to see what Cowtown Vettes was all about. We ended up doing the show thing, but we had fun and met some really nice people, some of whom are still around, like Larry and Sylvia Hoaldrige. We were even invited to their wedding in November 1975.

Fairy tales usually don't have a happy ending and neither did our marriage. After 17 years of being married, we decided to go our separate ways. It was very difficult on all of us, especially for the boys, who were ages 12 and 10 at the time. Being the ages they were, Jim, my first husband, thought it would be best if they were with him and I couldn't argue. They ended up in Austin, Texas for a while and Jim would fly them up to visit with me once a month.

I met Allen Shanholtz in February 1978 and after dating for exactly three years and three days, we married on Valentine's Day in 1981. At the time, I figured out that between us we had three sons, three houses and three cars. So I guess that the number three is lucky for us. I have heard the expression that everything happens for a reason and, looking back, Allen was the reason for my becoming happy once more in my life. Even both of my sons truly think very highly of him. Allen's son lives across the Atlantic in England, but we manage to see them at least once a year. His son is married now and they have three children. Both of my sons are married and together they also have three children. I believe that Allen finally joined the Club in April 1984 and we have managed to keep Low Let running, but not very often. She is mostly retired now, having over 100,000 actual miles on her. In December 2005, Allen spotted a 2001 Blue Corvette from the highway while driving to work one day. Two months later we ended up driving it home. Having another Corvette was a good reason to clean out the garage, so both could be parked inside. That Corvette was more trouble than we had planned on and, while up at our sponsor's dealership waiting to pick up the blue Corvette, I casually mentioned to Allen, "Just how much money are we going to spend on this vehicle?!" He didn't have an answer for me so, just for the heck of it, I went inside the showroom and looked around. At the time, they had a couple of 2008's around, but they were both convertibles. We wanted a coupe and there was only one, so we picked it. Her name is Silver Queen and it was bought as Allen's retirement present. This was in September 2007. May 29, 2008 marked Allen's last day at his work place; he is now fully retired. One of our goals is to drive a Corvette in every state before we aren't around anymore... Route 66, here we come!!

I hope that you have enjoyed hearing about Low Let. If I had a penny for every photo taken of her, we would be rich. I enjoy talking to folks when we have car shows, always learning something new about her in some way. I hope to keep her until at least December 2010, when she will celebrate a milestone...she will be in the family for 50 years. Not very many people can say that.

CHARITY REPORT



From I-20: Exit Trail Lake Drive, proceed North. At the traffic light at Granbury Road, stay in the left lane and go straight under the railroad overpass (remains one of an old wooden trestle). Go straight, up a small hill by Westcliff Elementary, then down the hill to Manderly Place on the right. Turn right onto Manderly Place, then turn right into the First Congregational Church parking lot. Drive around the back (to the right) of the Church to get to the staging area.

From I-30: Exit University Drive South and proceed South through eight lights. You will cross the Trinity River, pass the Fort Worth Zoo, go in front of University Christian Church and past the TCU campus. A few blocks after you cross Berry Street, you will come to the Bluebonnet Traffic Circle. Go right on the circle, pass Biddison and turn off the Circle onto Park Ridge. It eases right to become South Hills Drive, with Bluebonnet School on the left. Continue on South Hills Drive past the Fina Station on the right and the Fire Station on the left. South Hills Drive will go straight at a gentle V. Go left and you are on Trail Lake drive. Continue South on Trail Drive about .6 mile. (Be sure to slow for the dip.) Turn left onto Manderly Place and right into the First Congregational Church parking lot. Drive around the back (to the right) of the Church to get to the staging area.



Cowtown Email Lists: If you change your email address, please let me know so we can update your address on the various email lists. eMail TIP: Speaking of our email lists... when you receive an email that was sent to the CTV-ALL list and you reply, it automatically sends that email back to the entire list. For this reason, we have left this list as "moderated" list, meaning that every email sent to CTV-ALL is looked at for approval or rejection, since most responses are meant only for the originator. This is the only CTV email list which is moderated and it is that way to eliminate all the extra emails you would receive when members reply to all. When an email to CTV-ALL is rejected, I do send a copy of the email to the originator, copying the person that was replying so that the intended message does get sent.

To eliminate this moderating effort, you can remove the CTV-ALL out of the To: line and replace it with the originator's email address, which is shown on the original email (highlighted in the example).

I simply copy it from the original email and paste it into the reply email, replacing the CTV-ALL address list.

While this isn't a big deal to me to moderate the list; some folks that get their emails rejected have been wondering why; and now, as Paul Harvey states: "*now you know the rest of the story.*" ✍




