NCCC Competition Rule Clarification

The NCCC Competition Committee has clarified the rule regarding fire extinguishers. Effective May 1, 2009, any fire extinguishers must continue to be rated 5BC or better and now must have a gauge showing full charge. Additionally, it is now required that the mounting bracket and strap be metal. Note that fire extinguishers are required in all events for Groups II & III cars and are required in Group I & IS cars in a high speed event.

NCCC SCHOLARSHIP INSTRUCTIONS

The NCCC Scholarship program is funded through donations from Clubs, individuals and corporate friends such as MID AMERICA MOTORWORKS. 





Jul '85 - CTV wins Club Participation Award at Convention in Tulsa.


Aug '85 – DEBBIE [Lindsey] and SYLVIA [Hoaldridge] are elected RE and RMD, respectively.




