
We are happy to be new members of Cowtown Vettes and hope to be a good members for years to come.

PARDON FROM THE GOVERNOR

... a report from the NCCC Governor

Well, I had not planned to be at the April membership meeting. I thought my work at Texas Motor Speedway would keep me from attending. When SHARON ZSCHIRNT and I were able to leave earlier than expected – we were riding together – and found ourselves driving right by the meeting place, it was a no-brainer to come to the meeting. After all, who can resist 35th anniversary cake (and free beer)? I didn't have a presentation planned, so my off-the-cuff remarks about NCCC sanctions were probably more confusing than normal. More about that later... I also have to apologize to our new members, JOHN & NANCY DICK and DONALD & CYNTHIA RANKIN, for not having the NCCC membership forms with me.

NCCC sanctions...

These are permission to conduct an official NCCC competitive event which follows the rules in the NCCC rule book and awards valuable NCCC points to the competitors. Each NCCC club is allowed to conduct up to seven (7) NCCC sanctioned events each year. This year, Cowtown Vettes will be conducting seven (7) low speed autocross events at Texas Motor Speedway. We plan to present six (6) autocrosses, time permitting, on Saturday, September 19, and one autocross on Sunday, September 20. But, wait; it gets more complicated. Our friends at Brazos River Corvette Club in Granbury are unable to use their seven (7) sanctions this year. They are permitting CTV to use these sanctions. CTV will host three (3) of the BRCC sanctions on Sunday, September 20, giving our quests four (4) autocrosses to enjoy. Along with the six (6) on Saturday, we will have a total of 10 autocrosses during the weekend. This should help increase the draw for our TMS event, which is one of the best in the Southwest Region. But that's not all. We will host the other four (4) BRCC sanctions -- as autocrosses -- at a low-key weekend on the Mineral Wells Ring, June 13. These events will be similar to our recent practice autocross at Mineral Wells. But. wait, there's more. Our friends at Corvette Club of Texas have had to reschedule their fall events (normally held at the Grayson County Airport near Sherman), so they will host their seven (7) sanctions as low speed autocrosses in conjunction with the events we host for BRCC at Mineral Wells. A total of 11 autocrosses on June 13 & 14 should help the attendance for that weekend. Incidentally, all of these autocross events are 'First Choice' events for the Southwest Regional Championship Points Trail, but that's a topic for another time.

NCCC sanctions can be used for other competitive events such as rallyes, drag races, concours, etc. At this time, autocrosses are preferred by most competitors and 'points chasers.'

Somehow it doesn't seem much clearer when I've explained it more carefully.

NCCC SCHOLARSHIP INSTRUCTIONS

The NCCC Scholarship program is funded through donations from Clubs, individuals and corporate friends such as MID AMERICA MOTORWORKS. The NCCC Scholarship Committee awards \$1,000.00 scholarships to worthy young people who have some connection with NCCC through a Father, Mother, Grandfather, Grandmother, etc., who has been a member of NCCC for at least three years. "Some connection" implies that the Applicant's relatives should have knowledge of the various requirements of the Scholarship Program.

If the relative is not the Applicant's parent, the relative must write a letter to be included with the completed application indicating the following:

- That He/She has been closely involved with NCCC for a period of three or more years.




ATTENTION CTV MEMBERS ~ TECH ARTICLE

...we were cruisin' down the highway when.. .WHAT THE HECK? ...the engine started missing, feeling like it was hitting on six-to-seven cylinders instead of eight, then the service engine soon light appeared \otimes

If you don't own a scanner to check codes, you can stop by an *AutoZone* and they will perform a scan for you; in this case the printout showed issues with the #4 ignition coil; *P0354 Ignition Control #4 Circuit*. Since AutoZone (nor other auto parts stores) don't typically stock these coils I would recommend <u>contacting Tim</u> (our parts rep at *Bruce Lowrie*) and he will fix you up. Replacing the coil is very easy - no matter what your technical level is; 15 minutes tops.

<u>Tools needed</u>: your hands and a 1/4" drive ratchet with a 10mm socket. It is recommended that you grab a deep socket since the coil bolts that hold the fuel rail cover have a shaft on top making them longer which typically won't work with a short socket.



1. Start by removing the Fuel Rail cover on the side of the engine that the bad coil is located - these just pop off the studs that hold them in place; not tools. Hint: odd are driver's side and evens are on the passenger's side of the engine.




2. Once you have the fuel rail cover removed, you will see four coils (per side), one for each cylinder of the engine. Using the diagram above, locate the coil which was identified on the scanner printout. Once you have located the problem coil, pull the white retainer clip (top arrow) which holds the wiring to the coil.

3. Next, pull the coil wire from the bottom and let it hang until you have the new coil mounted.

4. Next, you will need to remove the two bolts that secure the coils to the mounting brackets. Again, if the coil bolt is one that has a long shaft on it, that is one which holds the fuel rail cover on your engine; which typically takes a deep socket. Go

ahead an remove both bolts and the coil wiring will keep the coil from falling down into the engine compartment.



6. Ignition Coil Testing can be done with an ohmmeter:

Connect the probes between the primary terminal

connection and coil ground with an ohmmeter on the high scale. The ohmmeter's reading should be very high and around infinity. Replace the coil if it isn't.

 Use the ohmmeter on the low scale and connect the probes between both primary terminal connections. Replace the coil if the ohmmeter's reading is very low or zero.





• Switch the ohmmeter back to the high scale. Connect the probes between a primary terminal and the secondary terminal connections. The reading this time should be high, but not infinite

Installation of the new ignition coil is as simple as repeating steps 1-5 above, in reverse order. Once it has been installed, start the engine and you should be firing on all eight again ©


