There were neither cows nor horses killed during this rallye. Drivers, that may be another thing.





ATTENTION CTV MEMBERS

According to 4.0 BY-LAW CHANGES:

Any By-Law amendment must be presented to the Elected Officers first and then printed in the newsletter prior to being presented to the general membership. All actions regarding amendments to the By-Laws will be governed by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the membership present at the meeting.

The following changes have been proposed by the By-Laws Committee:

6.0 ELECTION OF OFFICERS, Section 6.3 currently reads:

When conducting elections of officers, the Secretary (or a designee appointed by the President) will oversee the mailing of the official election ballots, postmarked no later than two (2) weeks prior to the election, to the current official roll of voting members. The election ballot shall serve as official notice of an election. The Club newsletter and website shall serve as a resource for information concerning the election. The completed election ballot must be mailed to the Club Post Office Box as instructed in the ballot or submitted in person at the next membership meeting, prior to the beginning of the counting of the votes, to be valid. Only one completed ballot per member will be accepted. When a majority vote is not obtained or in case of a tie, a secondary or run-off ballot will be distributed to the members present at the membership meeting at which the votes have been counted. All votes from the membership will be counted by at least two (2) Club members, who are not on the ballot. The nominee attaining a majority will be elected or in the specific case of voting for multiple open Board Member positions, the ballot will contain instructions so that the nominees with the most votes will be elected to fill the available positions.

6.0 ELECTION OF OFFICERS, Section 6.3 is proposed to read:

When conducting elections of officers, the Secretary (or a designee appointed by the President) will oversee the mailing of the official election ballots, postmarked no later than two (2) weeks prior to the election, to the current official roll of voting members. The election ballot shall serve as official notice of an election. The Club newsletter and website shall serve as a resource for information concerning the election. The completed election ballot must be mailed to the Club Post Office Box as instructed on the ballot or be submitted in person or by another member residing in the same household, at the next membership meeting, prior to the beginning of the counting of the votes, to be valid. All ballots must be enclosed in a sealed envelope with the name(s) of the voting members(s) written on the outside. Only one complete ballot per member will be accepted. The presiding officer shall appoint at least two (2) members, who are not on the ballot, to count the vote. The nominee attaining a majority will be elected or in the specific case of voting for multiple open Board Members positions the ballot will contain instructions so that the nominees with the most votes will be elected to fill the available positions. When a majority vote is required but not attained or in the case of a tie, a run-off ballot shall be distributed to the membership at that membership meeting. Run-off ballots shall include only the nominees tied with the most votes or they shall include the nominee with the most votes and the nominees(s) with the second most votes. Balloting will continue, using this same procedure, until a majority is attained.

2009 NCCC Convention

Convention this year was in Colorado Springs. It was nice to get out of the August Texas heat for nine days. The mountain scenery was breathtaking. This was a very special Convention and celebration; it marked the 50th national convention which coincidently occurred in NCCC's 50th year. We had 7 days of competition and parties based out of the Crowne Plaza hotel.

Competition consisted of two Concours events, a funkhana, a rallye, both lowand high-speed autocrosses at Pikes Peak International Raceway, and both record (class) drags and bracket drags at Bandimere Speedway (near Denver).

The social activities included a week-long hospitality room, parties, a trip to Cripple Creek, dinner and entertainment at the Flying W Ranch, and a parade to Woodland Park. 





























































































CTV CHARITY REPORT




