# **A Sticky Situation**

I don't know about you, but I never look forward to removing labels, decals, emblems, trim pieces, or anything else that is attached to my Vette with adhesive. I have no formal Chemistry or Adhesive background, but I would like to relate to you my experiences with these Sticky Situations.

First, the obvious goal is to remove the offending object from your Vette, or any other valued object, without any damage to the underlying surface (usually paint). The general observation is that recently applied adhesive is easier to remove than old adhesive, but this does not effect the range of techniques I will discuss; only the effort you will have to expend. Objects either have a thin adhesive layer backing, or are attached with "3M" double-sided adhesive foam tape. Using a plastic bondo/caulk spreader, or credit card, attempt to lift the edge of the object. (Note, save those promotional dummy credit cards you get in the mail. They make handy spreaders and scrapers.) Pull or lift the edge of the object very slowly. Lightly heating the object with a heat gun, or hair dryer, usually softens the adhesive and makes removal easier. If you pull or lift too quickly, you may damage a painted surface, or at the least, leave adhesive residue on the surface which still has to be removed. In the case of emblems or trim pieces that have been attached with "3M" foam tape, you may have to use a length of Dental Floss to saw through the foam part of the tape to remove the object. This still leaves



foam tape residue stuck to the surface. If you managed to remove the object but still have an adhesive residue on the surface, you have probably realized that this is not a quickie project. Try removing the adhesive with a little heat and a plastic scraper. Also, sometimes pressing a piece of masking tape to the adhesive, then pulling away, will remove the adhesive. If this doesn't work, you will have to use a solvent-soaked rag. The danger with using a solvent, is that it may react with a plastic or painted surface. When using solvents, it's a good idea to wear "Nitrile" disposable gloves, to protect your skin from absorbing the solvent. Nitrile gloves are better than Latex gloves because Nitrile is less reactive to solvents. I find Rubbing Alcohol is the safest solvent to try. You may also try commercial products like "Goo Gone". Getting a little more aggressive, I find that "WD-40" and "Turtle Wax Bug & Tar Remover" work surprisingly well. If the adhesive is still not coming off, try Denatured Alcohol or Lighter Fluid (Naptha). Remember to test solvents first on a sample of the surface that is not visible. Also, do not get too aggressive in rubbing with the solvent-soaked rag, as it may dull the painted finish. Finally, I would not recommend using Acetone or "3M General Purpose Adhesive Cleaner" unless you are working on bare metal, like removing balance weights from the inside of a wheel rim. Having successfully removed the adhesive, I apply Meguiar's Cleaner Wax (or similar product) to polish any dulling of the paint.

#### A QUICK NOTE ON HELMETS

Most of us have helmets that conform to one of three specifications as per the NCCC rules:

- **Department of Transportation (DOT)** DOT specifies headgear for use on motorcycles, ATV's, bicycles, skateboards, etc.
- Snell Foundation The Snell foundation has two specifications: one for motorcycles (e.g., M2005) and one for automobiles (e.g., SA2005)

Periodically, the Snell foundation updates its specification in an effort to improve the quality of head protection in motorsports. Having worked tech inspection a bit and also inspected helmets, I can safely say that most helmets are an even split of SA *(or M)* 2000 and 2005. If you currently use a SNELL 2005 helmet and the SNELL foundation continues its updates as they have in the past, you should be able to use your helmet for another five years. Since I have a SA2000 spec helmet, I am going to wait and try to acquire a SA2010 spec. helmet. I am not that familiar with the DOT specification but, it is my understanding that it does not change as often as the Snell specs.

A WORD OF CAUTION: Having searched the net, it is apparent to me that there are many opportunities to purchase helmets at a deep discount and this may meet your needs. HOWEVER, those helmets are the 2005 specification or earlier. SA/M 2010 has not been finalized and is not scheduled to be released until around October, 2010. Make sure you understand what you are purchasing.
