14th Annual Super Speedway Weekend at Texas Motor Speedway; September 17th thru the 19th.

We heard lots of great comments from our guests, some stating that "this was the best NCCC event that they had ever had the pleasure of attending." Others commented on the "excellent hospitality and fellowship of the Saturday Evening festivities" while others liked the course layout



"something new that challenged their driving skills" So, all of us should be proud of the work <u>you did</u> in making this event a great success!!!

We had three Novice NCCC Competitors on Saturday and three more on Sunday which

were not NCCC nor club members.

We are still finalizing the expenditures, including the actual cost of the facility so we hope to have the final income numbers out to you soon.

I would like to provide a high-level recap of the event since we won't be at the October Membership Meeting; especially for those that weren't able to make it out to the event.

Friday, we started around 3pm at the NEXTEL garage getting things setup; with rigs starting to show up around 4pm. We took possession of the road course promptly at 5pm to start setting up the course and corner worker stations. Registration and Tech started promptly at 6:30pm with two tech lines and a great group working to competitors registered and their Vettes teched.

Saturday morning, we started with registering and teching the entrants who didn't show up on Friday night. The Driver's Meeting at 8:30 followed by course drive thru with the first car out was promptly at 9am, as advertised. We had a few timing and printer issues but no major delays of any kind on Saturday; completing six autocrosses by 3:32 pm. We opted to call it a day to let everyone get back to relax, take a swim and relax before the evening activities. Entrants in the event ranged from a very nice '66 coupe all the way up to a ZR-1 and every Vette variation in between.

COWTOWN CRUISER






