

COWTOWN CRUISER



So far this year, the weather has been a little iffy however there have been a couple of nice days in between for cruising so be sure to take advantage of those as they occur. I say that and other than driving back and forth to work, we haven't cruised for fun yet, let alone to capture a few points.

I've been asked how do I get started with the cruiser program so here is a quick intro on the program: The Cowtown Cruiser Program (CCP) was founded in 2005 and has evolved year-by-year as the participants submitted suggestions. The competition program was founded to promote members to enjoy their Vettes and to get out and see places that they typically would not. One of the goals was to also promote Cowtown Vettes while you are out having fun in your Vette. You can participate in the program alone, with your significant other, or as an organized cruise. As you participate, you will find yourself venturing off the major highways to small rural towns to

capture that letter for a city or county – you will be amazed at some of the things you see along the way.

General Info:

- Do some research before you head out, especially to locate historical markers, churches, state & national parks, forests and war memorials.
- Never pass up a cruiser point; it is easier to find one of a higher point value later in the year than to go back to one you passed up.
- Keep a cruiser logo and log sheet in your Vette at all times would recommend putting them in a clear sleeve.
- Review the General Rules (not publically found on the web); they are not as complicated as they look
- Skim thru the How-To-Guide (available on request); it will help you organize your photos
- There are several Q&As on our website; skim thru them, they will answer several questions.
- There are several sources for Cruiser Reference Data on our website.
- Our website also has links for 35 and 50 point easy Cruiser Trips (with maps) within our surrounding area.
- If you would like to sponsor an organized cruise, it is worth five additional points on your log sheet.

Things you will need:

- A Corvette it can be your Vette or one you rented while out of town. It can even be trailered as long as it isn't on the trailer in the photo.
- A camera (digital is highly recommended)
- Cruiser Logo sheet for photos (and/or be wearing a Cruiser T-Shirt) current year logo
- Cruiser Log Sheet for tracking your stops

Cruiser Tips:

- You and part of your Vette must be visible in the photo; neither the entire Vette nor you in the photo is required.
- The name of the stop you made must also be visible in the photo; sometimes taking a close-up photo of a historical marker is also beneficial.
- Remember that historical markers add 1 point, no matter which state; most courthouses have them.
- Remember out-of state stops add 1 point to the base point over a Texas stop

 Examples: A city limit or county sign at the edge of a Texas city/county is worth 1 point, if you find that same letter city/county outside of Texas, it is worth 2 points; if you find one out of state with a historical marker, it becomes worth 3 points. State/Nat'l parks and forests also count more out of Texas.
- You can use the same photo for both city and county; however you need to turn in two copies if you do that; one for city and one for county.
- Your annual cruiser photo collection can be turned in hard copy or electronically (with restrictions).

Awards:

- Everyone that captures a minimum of 35 points will receive a bronze participation award. With 50 points you will receive Silver and 75+ points you will receive Gold level participation awards.
- There are 1st, 2nd & 3rd place awards presented for the top three participating members. If two members tie with point totals, they will both receive an award for that place.

The custom graphic for the 2011 Cruiser Shirt has been completed, with T-Shirts available at a cost of \$12 each, in either white or gray. Some of you preordered at the January meeting however if you didn't and you'd like to get one on order, call or drop me an email with the quantity, size and shirt color.






