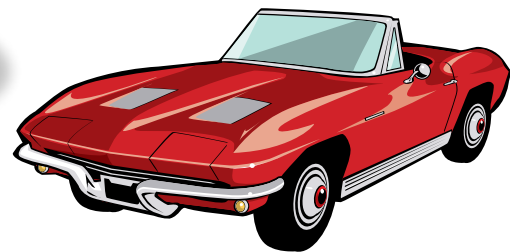
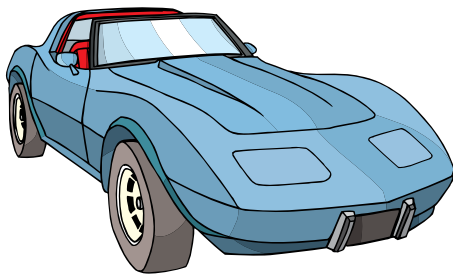
Since we are having the ice cream in August, we will not have an organized After-Meeting Social again this month, but we'll probably pick it up again in September.

With the goal of hosting CTV's biggest car show, YOUR help is needed by signing up to show your car or signing up to work (i.e. car show set-up, staging, parking, hospitality, counting ballots...just to name a few). If you are interested in joining the Car Show Committee, it's not too late. Have you marked your calendars for **CTV's 10th Annual All Corvette Car Show -- OCTOBER 15?** The car show flyer/registration form will be emailed to all club members shortly. Extra copies will be available at the August 5 membership meeting. Be sure to pick up some to distribute to Corvette owners at area car show and to give to your non-CTV Corvette friends. Further car show details will be put in future issues of *The Cowtown Low-Down* and on the CTV website.

The proposed 2011 Car Show Budget will be presented for membership approval at the upcoming August 5 membership meeting.

CTV Car Show Points...Have you been busy showing your car and representing Cowtown Vettes in the many car show events that are happening in and around the Metroplex, the State and the Nation? If so, I need to know. Please provide me with details no later than the **1st of each month** in order to recognize you in the next *The Cowtown Low-Down* and to get credit for the car shows you've entered this year.

DON'T FORGET... The 2011 car show season is **January 1 thru November 13**, which is the weekend prior to Thanksgiving; and only Corvettes are eligible (no other member-owned vehicle). Participant must be a representative of Cowtown Vettes. REMINDER... Points as shown below will be awarded to the car, not the participant.

- Show Entry (per show day, i.e. 3-day car show* would receive 3 pts) – 1-x pts
- Show Award [1st Place (or Top 20, Class Winner)] – 3 pts
- Show Award [2nd Place (or Class Award)] – 2 pts
- Show Award [3rd Place] – 1 pt
- Show Award [Club Sponsor Car Exhibition/Display] – 5 pts
- Best of Show – 5 pts
- Sponsor or Manager Award – 4 pts
- Best Paint, Best Engine, Best Interior, etc. – 2 pts
- Mileage Points (one way) from downtown Fort Worth (unless you live over 50 miles from CTV's PO Box in downtown Fort Worth) 100-299 miles – 1 pt, 300-599 miles – 2, 600+ miles – 3 pts.

COWTOWN CRUISER



Cruise to Sweetie Pie's and Brushy Creek Vineyards (Donald & Carlanne): On June 18th, 2011 thirty Cowtown Corvette members and their guests departed Coors for a cruise to Sweetie Pie's Ribeyes located on the square at the Wise County Court House, Decatur, Texas. Sixteen Corvettes made the trip traveling back roads in Tarrant, Denton, and Wise Counties. Just outside Decatur, we stopped for pictures at the Texas Tourist Camp, a gas station, café, and cabins covered with petrified wood. The Tourist Camp was built during 1927 and is one of the few intact examples of tourist camps built through Texas during the mid-20th century related to the early development of automobile tourism. The cruise continued on to the Wise County Court House square for lunch at Sweetie Pie's Ribeyes (one of the Babe's restaurants) and shopping at the many stores located on the square.

Following lunch, 12 members and guests in six Corvettes continued the cruise to Brushy Creek Vineyards. Back roads through Wise County were taken and we passed by the site of the Battle of the Knobs. At this location on November 10, 1837, a company of eighteen Republic of Texas soldiers engaged in a battle with approximately 150 Indians. Ten Texas soldiers and an estimated fifty Indians died. The cruise continued through Alvord, Texas and north to the Brushy Creek Vineyards. The owner gave us a tour of the winery. His knowledge and enthusiasm for wine making was apparent. The wine tasting was fun and informative and a number of bottles of wine made the return trip home.

Rumor has it that one couple turned the wrong way leaving the winery and had to be turned around by Oklahoma State Police. They did seem to spend a lot of time tasting the wine.

We would still like to get a few more cruises booked for the year; even if just a 1/2 day / lunch cruise; it doesn't have to be a weekend cruise. If you have an interest in hosting one, contact us and we will get you started; we even have some cruises that we can help you plan out. 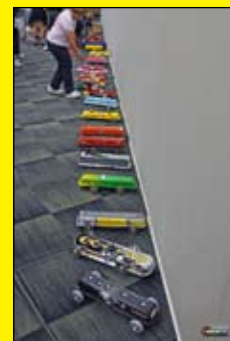
