



HAVE YOU REGISTERED?

I know some of you will be in Oklahoma City for seven (7) autocrosses at the Sheriff's Facility. However, I know that those of you not racing will not want to miss CTV's premier car show event of the year. Register <u>before</u> October 10 and pay

the early fee of \$20 for one (1) car, \$35 for two (2) cars in the same family; or register <u>after</u> October 10 and pay the late fee of \$25 for one (1) car, \$40 for two (2) cars in the same family. Registration forms will be available at the October 7 membership meeting.

A worker sign-up sheet will be emailed to everyone shortly. I hope that you will volunteer your time for one of many tasks to be done the day of the Car Show — help with set-up on Saturday morning (early), parking, directing entrants to their respective spots, registration, hospitality, door prizes, raffle tickets, photography and counting car show votes. COWTOWN CRUISER



Our *Corvette Heartbeat Weekend* at the GM Assembly Plant was a huge success and details will be shared at the October Membership Meeting. This is the event that we co-host with Corvette Club of Texas (CCT) using four of the Brazos River Corvette Club (BRCC) bartered sanctions. This joint partnership provided the 38 competitors with an eleven event weekend which was down from 48 competitors last year. Several conditions resulted in the reduced turnout with the primary one being that the event date was posted late (due to two location / date changes) after many competitors had other plans. The other factor was the event being held over Labor Day weekend.

There were many positives for the event which workers and competitors really enjoyed with the primary ones being the location, the course layout and the driving surface. What was designed as a fairly technical course turned out to be one that the C5s chewed up taking the fastest times of virtually every autocross. We had one competitor that state they were very skeptical about coming to this event; after the event was over they stated "I typically never run parking lot courses — only road course events, however this was a great course and I really enjoyed it"

We had a great group of workers who came out to make this event a successful, safe and fun time for our guests — we thank you!!!! There were several CCT members that worked our four autocrosses and in turn had several members that stayed all day Saturday and even came back out Sunday to work the last four autocrosses to work with CCT; it was a great partnership. Paul & Mary Wolter of CCT sent a very nice email sharing their appreciation for all planning efforts that went into the event and thanked all the CTV workers that stayed to help them with their autocrosses.

We have been asked by several competitors and even our own workers if we are looking to repeat the event at the GM next year. The issue with using the GM Assembly Plant is that they can only guaranteed a two-day date on major holidays since the manufacturing plant is closed; so, you can guess what those seven weekends are. While a full weekend event like this year doesn't seem to be in the cards at this time, we will continue to work with GM to see if there

are any other options that might help us utilize their facility for the joint weekend event next year. It is looking very promising for us to be able to host our spring practice autocross there since it is a one-day event; and it can be hosted on Sunday (which the plant doesn't work).

Following up on my lead in topic for this article; we chose GM's offer for many reasons as you might imagine and when doing so, we didn't realize that it would take over four months to finalize a contract with them; that the negotiations would be dealing with Detroit however with lots of assistance by Bill at the Arlington


