

Speaking of General Motors

On Jan. 30, 2012, the Ft. Worth Star Telegram reported that General Motors had announced that it will add a \$200 million stamping plant to its Arlington Truck Assembly Plant that will add another 180 jobs to the facility. The sheet metal stamping facility, to be built adjacent to the assembly plant, will be used to produce a new lineup of full-size sport utility vehicles beginning sometime in 2013. The company indicated last month that Arlington was being considered for the project.

The facility will strengthen the Arlington plant's long-term viability, city officials said. Locating the plant in Arlington "makes sense for GM," said Tracy Handler, an analyst for IHS Automotive. "It's such an iconic plant for Texas. Those are big pieces, and shipping, even by rail, is costly and time-consuming."

The investment not only creates "good American manufacturing jobs" but also would help save the company money as it works to remain competitive globally, Deputy City Manager Trey Yelverton said. "That's good not only for us and potential workers but for GM," said Yelverton, adding that the stamping facility could manufacture parts for other assembly plants in the Southern United States.

NCCC EVENTS

Cowtown's 2012 NCCC Events

The NCCC year has kicked off and Corvette fun is on the calendar with dates for our NCCC which have already been filed. In addition, with the 2012 NCCC Rulebook each club now receives ten NCCC Nat'l Sanctions each year. Counting the bartered sanctions, we have 20 sanctions for hosting some great NCCC events this year. This will impact/change our NCCC events to some degree however we have finalized exactly what changes will be made to our events; more around this in the upcoming months.



Our NCCC Events dates for 2012 are below and they are posted on the 2012 SWR webpage. Please mark these dates on your calendars so you can enjoy the events by participating and/or helping us to host them.

- *March 11, 2012: the Practice Autocross at the General Motors Assembly Plant in Arlington. This is a non-sanctioned event utilized to help our members shake-out their cars before the season starts but more importantly it will be to help our members learn the various responsibilities and components of hosting these events; learning / teaching event. It is also a great opportunity for you to see how your Vette handles in a controlled environment.
- *April 28-29, 2012: the Spring No-Frills event co-hosted by CCT; being planned as 14 low-speed autocross events.
- *September 15-16, 2012: Our 16th Annual Super Speedway Weekend at TMS; being planned as 12 low-speed autocross events
- Date(s) TBD: even with us hosting the events as identified above, we do have some additional sanctions due to the Nat'l Rulebook changes for 2012; we are looking into some type of non-racing event (i.e. funkhana, rallye, etc.) to utilize these; do you have ideas?
- * Designated as a Cowtown 100%er event in the months they occur.

We need functional chairpersons for the following positions for all events however we will focus on the practice autocross and April Event for now. We need a functional chairperson for Corner Workers, Course Setup / Teardown, Equipment (club trailer), Lunch, Pre-Staging, Starter, Safety Tech. Please contact me if you would be willing to step up for the club, in order to make these events a success.

Your participation in the events is welcomed and we do need your assistance in hosting and working these events; we need you to sign up as a worker and/or functional chairperson. Thanks in advance for supporting these events which in turn provides operating funds for our club and allows us to enjoy more Corvette fun.

The NCCC Scholarship program is funded through donations from Clubs, individuals and corporate friends such as Mid America Motorworks. The NCCC Scholarship Committee awards \$1,000.00 scholarships to worthy young people who have some connection with NCCC through a Father, Mother, Grandfather, Grandmother, etc., who has been a member of NCCC for at least three years. National Corvette Museum News



I was looking though the names of the people who are in the NCM's Hall of Fame. I came across Larry Shinoda's picture and a funny memory popped into my mind. Some of you

remember the 1992 convention CTV hosted. I'm telling you, what a week we had!!! Ask some of the old timers, we all have a fond, funny, tiring memory we could share. At the end of the long week there was a breakfast on Saturday morning before we all left for home. I don't remember what the breakfast was for but there were honored guests and the committee chairmen in attendance. I had bought a poster that depicted the 1,000,000th corvette made. I knew Larry Shinoda was going to be at the breakfast. I was determined to get Mr. Shinod's autograph on my very special poster. After we all ate our breakfast some got up and were mingling around while Debbie Lindsey was giving out door prizes. I jumped up and went over to Mr. Shinod and had to stand in line waiting patiently for my turn to ask for his autograph. While in line or when I had finally gotten to ask for the honored autograph, Debbie calls out my name which I did not hear. People around me said 'Kim, your name was called'. My reply was 'what, I'm busy here'. You see I was obvious cranky by the end of the week. I stepped away from Mr. Shinod, went and collected my envelope, and returned. He was very nice and gave me his autograph. I have the poster hanging in my living room and it will always be treasured. Okay, here's the funny part. I'm not sure how much time passed before I opened that blasted envelope. It was probably when I was unpacking once I got home, I can't remember because it was 20 years ago. In the envelope was a certificate for a set of tire, yes a set of tires. I was shocked! Sometime that year I put my new set of tires on my '69. They were a great set of tires because they almost lasted the 20 year since, ask James about them.

Larry Shinoda (1998 Induction)

Along with Bill Mitchell, designer Larry Shinoda has been closely associated with the Corvette Sting Ray, the stunning design that debuted in 1963. The Sting Ray literally set the world on its

ear. Few American cars were so instantly recognizable, so clean, and so pure. For the first time in its history, the Corvette staked its own uniquely American ground instead of looking to sports car tradition and Europe for inspiration. Larry played a major role in the execution of that design-from the original Q Corvette to the 1963 Split Window.

Born in Los Angeles of Japanese parents, Larry took to drawing images of cars when he was a young boy using broken pencil stubs. During World War II, Larry and his family, along with thousands of other Japanese Americans, were interned at Manzanar in California. While humiliating, the experience allowed Larry to showcase the benefit of a positive attitude. He amazed others in the camp by designing an armchair out of some old crates that featured a reclining back.

Besides design, his other love was racing. He joined the crew for the John Zink Special at the 1956 Indianapolis 500. The Offenhauser powered Watson racer sported Shinoda-designed bodywork and a distinctive dark-pink-and white paint scheme. And, of course, it won that year driven by Pat Flaherty. In 1968, Shinoda followed then-Chevy General Manager Bunkie Knudsen to Ford, and there he designed the Boss 302 Mustang, perhaps the most graceful Mustang ever produced. Later he established his own design company and designed everything from Roger Penske's race trailers to the Goodyear Blimp. He also created a sleek aftermarket body treatment for the fourth-generation Corvette called Rick Mears Special Edition. He even designed motorhomes for Monaco Motor Coach.

Larry succumbed to kidney problems in 1996 and was the subject of a massive fund-raising effort for a kidney transplant. Despite his handicap, he maintained a vigorous schedule. Sadly, he died November 13, 1997, at age 67 before the transplant could take place. His sister, Grace Nakamura, said, "Creative people take risks. They see things in new ways that the establishment doesn't agree with." Larry Shinoda will always be seen as a creative spark that helped define for the world what the Corvette is today.

TECHNICALLY SPEAKING

Does your C5 headlight emit a horrendous rat-a-tat of a machine-gun cacophony that announced the arrival of the headlight gear malfunction known all too well to many of us? To make a long story short, some of the factory gears just don't last; ours made it to about 140k before the passenger's side gave it up and would no longer open the headlight.

I set about ordering a repair kit, and I know Murphy's Law will probably get me but I decided to only change the broken passenger's side since somewhere I have gear that I never installed previously. I ordered and received the latest kit which is sold by various suppliers; they typically contain the same components; some have brass gears and some are still plastic like the factory.



My kit content contained: Top left-clockwise: Silicone lubricant, T-bracket with rubber bushing and plastic washer, brass gear, rubber gear insert, adhesive mixing stick and Urethane two-part, quick-cure adhesive.

I raised the hood

and laid out protective mats and towels. Since the headlight wouldn't raise on its own, I rotated the motor worm using the knob on the back of the gearmotor counterclockwise to raise the headlight assembly. This is a close-up of the gearmotor assembly from the back, with the protective boot off the motor worm knob.



Once you have the headlight up, remove the three screws from the plastic shroud using a Philips screwdriver.



Disconnect the main

electrical connector for the lights. Then disconnect the two smaller connectors for the low & high beam headlight bulbs themselves or just pull the lights out with the wiring harness complete (which I chose to do).

Front view of the gearmotor. Here you see the three mounting bolts. There are nuts on each bolt that need to be removed. There is also a nut on the other end of the center shaft you see that goes through the offending gear we're looking to replace. I used a 10mm gear wrench and a 10mm box-end wrench to unbolt these and was very care-



ful not to drop the nuts as it's a tight fit for my hands in there. If you drop them, you will need a magnet to fish for them. Removing the center nut allowed me to slip the linkage arm off the gear shaft and that immediately caused the headlight to freefall/

pivot so I was careful in easing it down as I removed the gearmotor.

The instructions indicated that the headlight assembly should be loosened and slid forward to allow removal of the gearmotor but I found I could remove it without doing that. Here is the extracted component.



The next step is to use two small screwdrivers to pop the gear cover off; the cover appears to be ultrasonically welded or glued. I was careful and slowly worked my way around the cover until it popped off in one piece.





The exposed gear shows no obvious sign of damage - yet.

Upon further inspection, you can see damage to the gear on the teeth at the top of the picture. Doesn't seem like much, but there's not a whole lot of engagement to begin with.



I cleaned up the gear case, installed the rubber insert into the brass gear, lubed up

the gear, shaft and worm with the silicone grease, slid the gear and plastic washer onto the shaft and then the gear and shaft into the case. Then it was time to prepare for the adhesive application. The instructions warn you to work fast when gluing the cover back on because there is only about a 5-6 minute working time once the two-part urethane is mixed. They aren't kidding either. It's important that both surfaces have adhesive



applied to them and that it is a contiguous ring all the way around the edge of the case to ensure the case is watertight.



After about 15 minutes, I checked for a good bond. Then I slid the T-bracket onto the shaft with the larger end of the rubber bushing towards to cover to retain it. The T-bracket was added to the kit after reports of cover separation due to adhesive failures caused by axial load of the gear shaft. The bracket helps to keep the cover in place.




It was a little tougher putting the gearmotor back in since there was nothing to hold the headlight up; so I used the rubber air hose which was soft yet stiff enough to support the weight of the headlight.

Next, I reinstalled the gearmotor and reassembled the headlight in the reverse order of

disassembly, making sure to slide the linkage onto the gear shaft in the proper orientation. Incidentally, if you were fortunate to raise your headlights electronically, when you started the procedure, the headlight position of the repaired side might be out of synch with the other side; this would be due to installing the gear shaft in a different position than where it was before you removed it (could even be about halfway up). This is not a problem because you can manually rotate the motor worm using the knob on the end of the motor until the headlight was in the fully raised position.

Finally, I tested the headlight raising/lowering action and confirmed it was working properly. Interestingly enough, the repaired side works faster than the other side, even though it isn't sounding like a machine gun yet.

TECH TALK

C-5 EMERGENCY BRAKE

DISCLAIMER: While this worked for me, I'm not saying it will work for everyone.

Went to get my '03 inspected and was turned down immediately because the e-brake lever instantly topped out. Doing a little online research I found that adjusting the e-brake isn't a simple tweaking of a cable anymore. The worst, and nearly most suggested method, involved removing the wheels, calipers, and rotors, then manually adjusting the e-brake star. This is NOT where I was looking to go. Another, much less suggested idea said to quickly pull up the e-brake lever three times, failing that, do the old back up the car and hit the brakes routine except use the e-brake. These two suggestions were generally ridiculed in the "most suggested" method articles. As you have no doubt surmised, the quick three pulls on the lever took care of my problem, although I also did the back up routine just for good measure.

The next time the e-brake was weak I tried pulling it both back and towards the driver, which also worked, got another sticker.

Again, this may not work for everyone, but it is quick, easy, and well within most of our price ranges. GOOD LUCK!


