#### **Cowtown's 2012 NCCC Events**

The NCCC year has kicked off and lots of Corvette fun is on the calendar with dates for our NCCC which have already been filed. In addition, the 2012 NCCC Rulebook now allows each club to receive ten NCCC Nat'l Sanctions each year. Counting the bartered sanctions, we have 20 sanctions for hosting some great NCCC events this year. We hope that you will come out to some NCCC events to participate, support your fellow members as they participate or as a worker. Cruisers, remember that you can earn NCCC points by showing up at NCCC events around the region; review the CCP rules for details and/or contact the cruiser chairperson.



Our NCCC Events dates for 2012 are posted on the 2012 SWR webpage. Please mark these dates on your calendars so you can enjoy the events by participating and/or helping us to host them.

- \*March 11, 2012: the Practice Autocross at the General Motors Assembly Plant in Arlington was cancelled. Unfortunately the rain forced us to make a call Friday morning on the event to avoid the possibility of losing funds if it was raining heavy on Sunday. The loss of funds would have included rental and delivery of a porta-jon on Friday along with the groceries for lunch. - September 30, 2012: we have submitted this Sunday date to the RCD, currently awaiting confirmation. This NCCC event will be to utilize four remaining Sanctions, 1 from BRCC and 3 from CCT. We are currently discussing the types of events however it is decided that they will be non-racing to allow those members to participate in NCCC events who do not want to autocross or drag race. We are leaning towards hosting the four events as a <u>People's Choice Car Show</u>, <u>Funkhana</u> and wrapping it up with a <u>Gimmick and Chance (Poker) Rallye</u> which will be run simultaneously. At our <u>2007 October Car Show</u> BRCC hosted similar events which included a Funkhana and 3 Rallyes. #### Helpful Hints – What is an official sign?

Most signs will be those found along the highways but can also be found on city, county, or state buildings and monuments. A city sign must have the name of the city such as a city limits sign, post office, city hall, school,

library, fire department, or church sign with the name of the city, or historical markers. Directional signs or mileage signs with the name of the city do not count. County signs are similar to city signs. A state sign must include the name of the state and can be found at state lines, tourist information centers, post offices, entrances to state parks, on state monuments and buildings, and on historical markers. A city sign with only the name of the city may not be sufficient to count as a state verification sign because many of the same city names can be found in more than one state (Ex: Gainesville is in Texas, Florida, and Virginia). If other information can verify the state in your city sign picture it may qualify.

Never attempt to get your photo with you and your car by the sign if it is not safe to do so. A distance shot will be acceptable if the sign can be read with a magnifying glass or there is a close-up shot of only the sign included with your car photo.

# COWTOWN VETTES CHARITY REPORT



#### NCCC/NKF Raffle Car Tickets

The race is on to sell the NCCC/ NKF raffle tickets. Our goal is to sell \$1550 in tickets which is the equivalent of 1 \$10 ticket per member for Cowtown to be recognized as a 100 % club. We have done very well so far as we have sold \$1200 in tickets to this point. We need to reach the \$1550 by June 21.
