

I finally completed the enclosed utility trailer (48 cu ft capacity) so Margaret had enough storage space for an eight day road trip. A short run to Waco for an autocross convinced me of the Vette and trailer's road worthiness. It was good to 90mph, don't tell TDPS!!

We managed to cover 1,500+ miles in eight days. We started in Haslet and followed US 287 to Amarillo. We spent the first night there with an afternoon spent on the restored section of 66 thru downtown and some automotive antique shopping. Oh, and of course we sampled the Big Texas Steak Ranch Restaurant.



We followed I-40 to Albuquerque with photo stops at the Cadillac



Ranch, Vega TX, and the Midpoint Cafe in Adrian, TX. As we were packing to leave Albuquerque, we received the unexpected news of Jim Benware's passing. We consulted our nonexistent itinerary, and decided to cut our trip one day short in the hopes the funeral ser-

vice would be the following Saturday. Also on this leg, we found a good stretch of old motels in Albuquerque, many more restored

motels in Tucumcari, NM, a great auto




The next day we made it to Flagstaff, AZ with stops in Gallup for more his-

toric motels and a side trip to the Meteor Crater. The facilities at the Crater have changed remarkably from when I was there as a teenager in the late 1960s. Another look at our crystal ball showed we were only seventy miles from the Grand Canyon. Margaret had not seen this magnificent example of uncontrolled erosion (a Sierra Club observation), so we included the East Rim and the inescapable South Rim the next morning. The canyon has not changed in fifty years but the crowds are much larger! After the Canyon we took one of the longer stretches of actual Route 66 and stopped at the Snow-









cap Drive In in Seligman, AZ. We pushed on to the California border which was one of our goals. At the welcome to CA sign, I noticed the speed limit for automobiles towing trailers was 55mph!! I had the cruise control set at 80mph since Haslet and decided "I can't drive 55." Margaret reminded me the whole state of CA was broke so we turned around at the next exit and headed back to Kingman, AZ for

the night.



The following day we traveled to Grants, NM with a most interesting stop on a Corner in Winslow, AZ. This stop included an inebriated German motorcyclist lying in the middle of the intersection so his buddies could take his pic-

More Secrets of the C5

- If you leave your turn signal on, in about 1 minute it will start to ding (loud enough to hear over the stereo) to let you know you have old timers disease.
- You can reset the oil life by pumping the gas pedal 3 times (but not with the engine running).
- Hold down the reset button while on one of the trip odometers and it changes that reading to the miles you've traveled since last starting the engine.
- Hold down the Active Handling button for 5 sec. to engage "Competitive Driving" on cars equipped with active handling (2000 and previous years must be stopped.)
- If you pull the seatbelts all the way out while you're buckled in, they ratchet back in to hold you tighter into the seat. (then move the seat forward to make it extra snug -- Leafty)
- Simply remove fuse #2 under the hood and your DRLs will be out permanently. Only thing affected is that when you unlock at night using the key fob your front turn signal lights and back up lights will not flash. Your front turn signals will operate normally, however.
- The side-view mirrors can twist both forward and backward, decreasing the chance of damage if struck.
- There is a release opening with a flap to let air out of the car when the hatch is closed. It is located just above the driver side rear compartment behind the carpet and on **the side** of the car. Not that it really works well.
- Also you can ground your amp to a screw/bolt that holds the rear middle compartment to the frame.
- If you have a 6-speed car you can pop the trunk when the car is running by lifting the e-brake.
- There is a spot on the driver side just out of the middle compartment under the carpet for the lug nut key. You should have a compartment on the drivers & passenger's side (in the trunk) and a center compartment. On the left (drivers) side of the center compartment, on the left side where the center cover fits, there is an 'indent' that holds the wheel lock key.




