GOVERNOR'S THOUGHTS

How a Club becomes a Top NCCC Club

In this Governor's article, I will share a brief overview of NCCC Events, the "Points System" and how it tallies up each year. First I'll start by discussing events, then the points, followed by how it all ties together. In this article, I will not cover all scenarios of points and the scenarios which can alter them for various reasons.

An NCCC Event is any NCCC Sanctioned Event hosted within a region and in turn, the nation. Each club receives 10

"official" NCCC sanctions each year to host events of their choice; the events can be anything from a car shows to racing type events. The most common type events in the southwest region (SWR – which CTV belongs to) are low-speed (LS) autocross events along with a few drag racing events. In other geographic areas / regions you will find that car shows and rallyes make up the bulk of their NCCC events with fewer racing type events. Our 16^{th} Annual Super Speedway Weekend is an example of a LS autocross event; Sept 15^{th} & 16^{th} . Two weeks after that event (Sept 29^{th}), Cowtown is hosting a 4-event Fall Corvette Scramble which is focused around non-racing events. This event will consist of a car show, a funkhana and two rallyes which; we hope you will all choose to participate.

Anyone that participates or works in any NCCC event earns points. All of these points add to their personal totals and to Cowtown's annual points total. These points then roll into the regional championship points chase and in turn, the national championship points chase. An example of 2012 competitors who are competing heavy this year would be Cathy & Kevin Anthony; both are currently 1st place in the SWR and both are currently 6th place in the nation! To chase points regionally and especially nationally, it takes a lot of commitment and yes, lots of time away from home and with that comes the expense. Competitors chasing points spend many a night in hotels, then the entry fees, buying tires, gas for a tow vehicle as well as their race car, not to mention numerous meals on the road. They do expend a lot personally to earn those rankings for themselves and in turn to earn Cowtown the

Glenda McMahan 2012 NCCC Governor glenda-gm@att.net recognition we receive each year. This year was CTV's 30th year to be recognized in the Top 15 – and this is Cowtown's 38th year of existence!

Next, a short explanation of the NCCC Points system which consist of Regional and National Points; typically the same count, unless the NCCC Convention is hosted in our region as it was in 2008. Each NCCC member that competes or works an event in the region earns their personal NCCC points. Those personal points are then added to the club's annual total (the club they are members) which are tracked at the regional level. The personal and club points also accumulate at the national level which is a ranking against all members across the nation.

Annually, the SWR recognizes the competitors who earn 200 points (competing or working) along with the top 10 men, women and clubs. The SWR also recognizes the top competitors in the region annually for their accomplishments for individual events; those consist of drags, concours (car shows), funkhana, speed events (high & low-speed) and rallyes. Nationally, the Top 15 Men, Women and Clubs are recognized each year at the National Convention.

With that brief overview, I'd now like to recognize those that are currently in the top rankings. In the SWR Top 10: For men, Kevin Anthony is currently #1 and Doc Lambert is #5. For women, Cathy Anthony is current #1 and Donna Forsythe is #6. Nationally, Kevin & Cathy Anthony are the only Cowtown members in the Top 15; both are currently ranked #6. Cowtown Vettes is currently ranked #2 in the SWR and #4 in the Nation.


The next SWR NCCC Events will be a Regional Fundraiser at the GM Assembly Plant in Arlington, TX on Labor Day weekend consisting of 13 LS autocross events. September 15-16th we host our 16th Annual Super Speedway Weekend at Texas Motor Speedway; 12 LS autocross events. September 29th we host the Fall Corvette Scramble in Mansfield, TX; a Car Show, Funkhana and 2 Rallyes. If you have any questions about these events you can contact either me or the event coordinators.

We did have a great time at Convention again this year; yes, even in Topeka, KS. Cowtown members did bring home numerous convention awards (in all the

categories) which included LS & HS events, drag racing, funkhana, rallye and even in the non-NCCC events like valve cover racing. Please check out the numerous event pages from the 53rd Convention on our Club's website which show photos of their accomplishments. Mark your






