

Secretary's Report

Coming Soon - Officer Nominations and Elections

It's time for CTV members to think about nomination and election of officers to serve in club leadership roles for CY2013. Members will have the opportunity to make nominations using nominating ballots at the October membership meeting and again from the floor at the November membership meeting.

If you know a member who you believe would bring quality leadership to CTV, you should contact that person and determine if they would be willing to serve and, as per the By-Laws, that they meet the following relevant qualifications.

Qualifications for Elected Officers Other Than President, Board and Junior Board Members:

- Must have been a member for a minimum of nine (9) months prior to the beginning of the term of office
- Must be a member in good standing
- Should have attended a minimum of two (2) Board meetings in the year of election

Qualifications for President:

- Must have been a member of Cowtown for a minimum of (2) years prior to the beginning of the term of office
- Must be a member in good standing
- Should have attended a minimum of six (6) Board meetings in that time period

Qualifications for Board Member:

- Must be a member who has served as an Elected Officer of the Club
- Must be a member in good standing
- Should have attended a minimum of two (2) Board meetings in the year of election
 One (1) of the four (4) Board Member positions will be assumed by the Immediate Past
 President

Oualifications for Junior Board Member:

- Must be a member for at least nine (9) months prior to the beginning of the term of office
- Must be a member in good standing
- Must be a member who has not served as an Elected Officer of the Club
- Should have attended a minimum of two (2) Board meetings in the year of election

NCCC EVENTS



Cowtown's 16th Annual Super Speedway Weekend was a great event, according to the feedback from our guests; Cowtown Members you should be very proud! We enjoyed hosting this event for competitors from many states, including Minnesota, Ohio, Missouri, Oklahoma, and of course Texas; lots of great comments verbally, via email and on Facebook. As the event neared, the weather forecast for the

weekend looked good, then terrible, then sort of good. The forecast was all over the place around when and how much it would rain.

On Friday, the team started setting up around 4pm; registration and tech prepared and were able to start early which helped to reduce the lines. This in turn enabled our guests to return to the hotel to enjoy hospitality. We finally received access to the road course around 5:30pm when we started setting up the course while TMS moved some of the concrete barriers so we could run the event counter-clockwise. Sherry Michener (chair) and Sharon Zschirnt got hospitality going at the host hotel to open by 6 PM. Great job at TMS guys and gals – I think this is the first year (that I can remember) that we were finished at TMS in time to make it back to the hotel to enjoy hospitality.

Saturday morning came way too early as we arrived at the track to start final preparations to start the event. Candy & Donn Beck (Timing) performed the final setup and testing to get things rolling, with assistance from Kevin Anthony on the wireless network for the remote printer located in the garage. Richard Downing got the corner worker equipment distributed and hosted the corner worker meeting. Pre-staging, led by Red Greenfeder, was ready with the grid and run-order of the participants; all setup just south of the Sprint Cup Garage. After the Driver's Meeting, we hosted four separate groups of parade laps to allow everyone to drive thru the course. *Corners, Timing, Starter, Pre-Staging are you ready?* ... after confirmation from all, we opened the event to let everyone enjoy the twelve low-speed autocrosses!

After finishing three autocrosses, TMS had us shut down for their workers to take their lunch break – which also provided a break for all our workers and participants to grab lunch. We started the event back up to continue the events without any major issues for the afternoon; encountering only a couple of minor delays. During autocross 7, due to TMS time constraints, we made a decision that we would only be able to finish running all the men today; that the ladies would have to run autocross 7 on Sunday morning.

We shut the event down for the Saturday, put up the timing heads, garaged the Corvettes and headed back to the host hotel for the evening. Upon arrival, Ina Kennedy (chair), Phil & Sharon were busy along with 360 Catering getting the Saturday night dinner prepped and ready to serve at 6:30. Sylvia Hoaldridge (chair), Kim and Jane were busy with NKF Charity Raffle sales. Dinner was served, enjoyed and then followed with the charity drawing & raffle which brought in a nice amount to benefit the North Texas Chapter of the National Kidney Foundation. Johnny Gann won the 5-lap solo drive on the TMS Oval and re-donated for auctioning it again; Bill Esicar (from MO – Midwest Region) was the winning bidder. Next, we presented the Fastest Time of the Day (FTD) Awards to the 1S, 1, 2 and 3/RP for the male and female competitors.

After the awards, the Southwest Region Officers, Club Governors and others moved into the meeting room for the third SWR Governor's Meeting of the year. Besides operating discussions, this is the meeting where clubs file and obtain approvals for their 2013 1st Choice NCCC Weekends; we received approval for our 2013 event dates – TMS is the only one in September.

Sunday morning, we awoke to rain, much needed for the area but dreaded for an autocross event; yes, we do compete in the rain. We arrived at TMS with uncertainty around the oval laps – TMS did allow them; which was the first time (in the rain). After the laps, we then readied the timing system, and proceeded with a Driver's Meeting to get the day rolling. One thing new that we offered (by show of hands) was to allow each participant to run one run of each autocross; anyone wishing to leave after their one run in the 12th autocross could. Those that wished to stay and take their second run of each autocross was welcome to – almost unanimously it passed. We had at least half of the participants opt to leave after their first run.

We started with autocross 7 for the women, followed by autocrosses 8-12 for everyone (1 run each). We were rolling strong until one of the timing heads went on the blink. Donn pulled the backup head and we got the event rolling again. Around 9 to 9:30 the drizzle stopped and the course became faster; the competitors with sticky race tires put them on their Vettes. We completed the autocrosses and the event about 2 to 2:30 PM just as it started to sprinkle again. As the participants loaded up and were ready to head out, many came by to say thanks and to offer the team accolades on a great event; *thank you all!* We were then able to get everything packed up and out before the heavier rain started, making for a much more pleasant ending to the weekend event.

We would like to recognize and thank all the functional chairpersons who stepped up to handle the many areas of this event; all did an awesome job as did the many folks who stepped up as workers. It takes a team to pull off a successful event like this and you all made that happen.

Southwest Region governors' meeting was Sat. night of our event. The Regional Competition Director (RCD) and the Regional Membership Director (RMD) offices were up for election. Craig Kamradt was unopposed as RCD to serve a second term. Jon Bradford let the board of governors know he would not run again; Bob Portillo was nominated (unopposed) for the next 2-year term.


