NCCC EVENTS



This year will conclude the third year I have served as your NCCC Events Coordinator. I would like to personally thank everyone who stepped up to make Cowtown's NCCC Events to make a great success. Cowtown's Team has upheld the "premier event image" within the Southwest Region and even on a national level. Not only is this image just about hosting the best events we can but it also allows us

to generate operating revenue for club necessities along with helping to fund the fun events like the annual Christmas Party & Awards Banquet.

We hosted the Fall Corvette Scramble on Saturday, September 29th, at Fat Daddy's in Mansfield, TX. It was a fun, one-day NON-RACING NCCC event which everyone was invited to participate. The festivities of the day included four sanctioned (non-racing) NCCC events; consisting of a People's Choice Car Show, a Funkhana and then simultaneously run Gimmick and Chance (Poker) Rallyes.

The weather forecast during the week leading up to the event was dreadful to good then went bad again; we had hoped it would work out as well as TMS had – it DID NOT ...we awoke on Saturday to it still raining and the radar didn't show it letting up until Sunday; unfortunately, NCCC events are rain or shine. We arrived at Fat Daddy's around 8 am with a group of workers ready and eager for event setup. Luckily, Alex (GM at Fat Daddy's) had agreed to let us use the outdoor patio area (with awning). The Fat Daddy's employees also mopped up the concrete in the area immediately before the Funkhana started.

The People's Choice Car show started at 10 am and lasted for 2 hours – yep, you heard correct, a Car Show being held in the rain; chaired by Rick Watson. While the participants were walking around with their umbrellas voting for their favorites in each class, the rest of us finished the setup for the Funkhana.

At 11 am, we had a quick Funkhana participant's meeting, prior to it getting underway ...and yes, there was some serious competition and cheering from the crowd! The participants had to see how fast they (as a team) could (1) blow-up a balloon and your partner pop it, then (2) roll a tire thru 3 cones, (3) screw 5 lug nuts on a hub, (4) install 4 spark plugs in an LT1 head, (5) throw 2 bean bags (simulating oil dry) thru the hole, then last (6) pick-up the trash at the event site, by throwing a minimum of 2 items in a bucket. With the sporadic wind gusts, the trash pickup proved to be the most challenging for many.

After the Funkhana, participants and workers had time to grab a bite to eat for lunch before Rick presented the Car Show Winners; presenting them with bag of Kumho goodies. Jack Gandy then hosted the Driver's meeting for the Rallyes. As the participants pulled up, David Gill & Tony Sokolosky teched the cars under the awning at Fat Daddy's. The checkpoints were hosted by Sharon Zschirnt, Scott Wheeler, Fred Rosett & David Gill along with Karla Gandy, where participants drew cards for their poker hand. Once you finished the rallye and returned to Fat Daddy's, you had time to enjoy a librion of choice while Jack scored the gimmick rallye sheets, coming up with the winners. We then presented the winners for the Funkhana and Rallyes; and a special thanks to Aaron Quine (Ohio) for providing the great Kumho goodies. Be sure to check out the Fall Scramble event pages and photos on our website.

For 2013, the NCCC Events WILL NOT BE crammed up in September as they were this year and last. At the September SWR Governor's Meeting, Glenda presented Cowtown's NCCC requested event dates and they were awarded to us; they are listed on the <u>SWR 2013 Schedule</u>. Please mark your 2013 calendars with the following dates:

- March 17?? Practice Autocross (non-sanctioned)
- April 21st & 22nd the No Frills joint Low-Speed NCCC Autocross Event with Corvette Club of Texas (CCT).
- June 1st or 2nd Spring Scramble; tentative plans would be an event similar to this year's Fall Scramble, without the rain.
- September 21st & 22nd the 17th Annual Super Speedway Weekend at Texas Motor Speedway

In closing, I would ask that you continue your support as Rick Watson takes over as your NCCC Events Coordinator next year. Rick was a great co-coordinator this year and he will do a great job for the club. I do know that out of the gate, he is seeking a co-coordinator for next year; so please give it some consideration and step up to support the club, to learn and to make a difference for Cowtown.
















GOVERNOR'S THOUGHTS

















