



Take a Lifesaving Step. Join me on Saturday, March 23, at Trinity Park. Meet other Walkers in the area around the Pavilion on 7th Street at 8:00 AM. The Fort Worth Walk will begin at 9:00 AM.

Why am I asking you to come and walk with me? Kidney Disease is directly associated to many of today's major health issues: obesity, cardiovascular disease, diabetes and high blood pressure, yet many doctors do not check for kidney disease until it has progressed into later stages and ultimately requires dialysis or a kidney transplant for survival. One in nine (9) people is affected by chronic kidney disease. Hispanic, African Americans, Asian Americans and Native Americans are most at risk for the disease. Every year our community of Walkers increases to help raise funds for the National Kidney Foundation's programs and services, such as research, kidney health awareness, patient services & education, advocacy for organ donation, Camp Reynal kids camp and much more.

As an active member of Cowtown Vettes and NCCC since 1975, I would like to share my story about how kidney disease derailed not only my life and my husband's life but our plans for the future. In August 2006, during a weeklong trip to Disney World for NCCC's annual Convention, I became ill with what I thought was a summer bout of flu or an allergic reaction to my hotel's remodeling--new paint, wallpaper, floor tile and carpet. My sense of taste went awry; a sip of Pepsi tasted salty and salty snacks, i.e. chips, pretzels, etc., were sweet. As my week in Orlando progressed, my energy, thirst and appetite waned. Upon my return home, my husband, Larry, immediately saw a drastically different wife than he had sent off to Orlando a week earlier -- no energy, difficulty breathing, extremely bloated.

I had two days (Sat. & Sun.) to decide which doctor I was going to call on Monday morning -- our GP or my allergist. I chose to contact our GP and was fortunate enough to be able to see his PA within an hour of my call. After a brief exam, the PA's diagnosis was that I had acquired a virus during my stay in Orlando, FL. Armed a prescription for Cipro, the PA instructed me to give blood before I left the office.

Larry then took me home and I managed climb into bed with five (5) pillows. Thirty (30) minutes later, our GP called and told me, "Get your butt to Baylor All Saints <u>now</u>. You have 3% usage of your kidneys." Instead of reacting excitedly, I calmly changed clothes, packed a little suitcase for what I thought would be a short hospital stay, and I waited for Larry to return from the drug store with my Cipro that would go unused

Larry and I arrived at the BAS Emergency Room with ER personnel awaiting my arrival. After some poking and prodding, along with numerous questions that even I had difficulty answering, I was transported to the 3rd floor (for patients with kidney [renal] problems). The next morning (August 14, 2006) dawned with my being prepped for surgery to insert an access in my neck for dialysis. [NOTE: The neck access is hooked to a dialysis machine for removing toxins from my blood...in lieu of working kidneys.] During my 3-1/2 week hospital stay, I was referred to by the 3rd floor staff as their "miracle patient," because no one could determine why my kidneys had failed. During my hospital stay, I dialyzed three times a week and my weight went from 178 pounds, my heaviest ever, to 145 pounds.

Since my GP did not have doctor's privileges at BAS, he handed me off to a kidney doctor with privileges. After about 2-1/2 - 3 weeks, I became terribly impatient; I wanted to go home. What I did not know at the time was my doctor had an idea of what had caused my kidney failure, but a 2nd opinion was needed. The 2nd opinion came from Dr. Mary Milam, a hematologist-oncologist. Her first visit came at 11:00 PM with an onslaught of questions. Before Dr. Milam left to continue her hospital rounds, she informed me that I would be having a bone marrow biopsy, followed by a series of skeletal x-rays (from the top of my head to my little toe). [NOTE: If you ever need to have a bone marrow biopsy (bmb), I strongly suggest you request twilight drugs to ease the excruciating pain that accompanies a bone marrow biopsy when only a topical numbing cream is used.) My husband firmly believes that his left hand, which I clasped during the bmb procedure, will never be the same. After two hours of lying flat on my back completely still, I was transported for my skeletal x-ray. Later that evening, while a close friend was visiting Larry and me, Dr. Milam came in to give me the news -- (1) THE GOOD NEWS...I have no holes in my bones; (2) THE BAD NEWS...I have Multiple Myeloma, cancer of the plasma cell. My calmness really scared me; I was immediately relieved to know why my kidneys failed.

However, while Larry and our close friend were in the hall, I suddenly felt like my lungs were going to burst! I had to relieve some inner tension -- I screamed at the top my lungs!! What a release that was.

After hearing the news and knowing what caused my kidney failure, I felt that I was ready to get on with my life. Larry and I had been making vacation plans and plans for the future. I was hoping to work part-time; I was looking forward to traveling to racing venues with Larry and racing our '66 pink race car; I wanted to devote some time to my knitting and crochet projects.

Within the next couple of days, Larry and I came to the conclusion that being on dialysis was going to be more of a life changer than having cancer. That conclusion has proved correct and we are making the very best of this situation.

When I said dialysis was going to be a life-changer, that's putting it mildly. Dialysis three days a week, 3-1/2 hours a day took immediate priority in our lives. With the help of my wonderful renal dietician and her continued patience and vast knowledge of a kidney-friendly diet, I have learned what I can and cannot eat; i.e. I have not had orange juice since I started dialyzing; it's not kidney friendly. I also had to learn to control my liquid intake... not just by bottle, glass, cup, etc. but liquid in jello, soup or any dish that contains any kind of liquid. With non-functioning kidneys, my body has no filtering system. I have to continue to monitor my phosphorous, potassium and calcium intake every day for the rest of my life

Being hooked to a dialysis machine is not a substitute for a long, healthy life. In my case, my healthy kidneys were attacked by a protein, which is a marker for Multiple Myeloma. I'm part of 12% of myeloma patients whose kidneys fail in an early stage of myeloma. As Multiple Myeloma becomes more prevalent with adults living longer, there is a slight increase in those myeloma patients who have to dialyze to survive

I was very fortunate that my Multiple Myeloma was found in an early stage due to my kidney failure. I was also very fortunate to have been able to donate my stem cells for my stem cell transplant that took place in April, 2007. Since that time, I see Dr. Milam every 8-10 weeks and go to U.T. Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas for blood tests four times a year and an annual bone marrow biopsy. Currently, my Multiple Myeloma remains in complete remission. I'm also trying to get on the kidney transplant list at Baylor Hospital.

I've wanted to write this article for a number of years and now feel that it is important to let readers know how important it is to take care of our kidneys. I pray that you continue to have healthy kidneys. However, I hope that you will discuss kidney disease to your doctor.

I look forward to seeing many of my Corvette friends on the trail on March 23rd.






