event. Our team has surpassed the goal of \$3000 with over \$3600 raised. Lunch at Pappasitos Cantina on Forest Park will follow. I would like to give a big THANK YOU to all who gave of their time and money to support this worthy cause.

Due to recent changes in the scheduled dates for our NCCC events there will be two 100%-ers offered for April. It's not much notice but you only have to attend one event to receive credit for the 100%-er award. You are welcome to attend both events if you so choose.

Don't put up those walking/running shoes because the first 100%-er will be the Komen Walk on Saturday, April 6. Karyn Fowler is coordinating this event and has made arrangements for parking at the Best Buy near Ridgmar Mall. The Cowtown Team will meet in front of Neiman-Marcus on the east side of the mall. 

The No Frills Autocross will be held at Mineral Wells Air Park on June $1^{\rm st}$ and $2^{\rm nd}$. 


