VICE PRESIDENT REPORT



Well, the weather did NOT cooperate with us for the NKF Walk and the event was cancelled by Fort Worth's Finest due to lightning. In spite of the bad weather we had 25 members show up to walk. All of you deserve a big THANK YOU again. Since it was only 8:30AM when the event was cancelled we voted to have breakfast at the Old South Pancake House instead of lunch at Pappasito's.

The first 100%-er event for April was the Susan G. Komen Walk on Saturday, April 6. Another big THANK YOU goes out to everyone that participated in this annual event. These two charity events are the main ones in which our members participate. If you missed one or both of them this year I hope you will consider participating next year.

The second 100%-er event for April will be the Vines-N-Vettes Car Show on Sunday, April 28, at the Lost Oak Winery. Because a band is playing there is a "cover charge" to enter the grounds but the registration fee for your car is cheaper than the cover charge. Registration begins at 2:00PM. It is a People's Choice voting so make sure you have your entry number on your dash. Bring a picnic lunch/ dinner/snacks to enjoy but NO ALCOHOLIC beverages. They must be purchased at the winery. You will also need to bring lawn chairs or blankets for seating. See the website for details.

The only 100%-er event for May is the Scramble on May 4. If you are not sure what some of the events in the Scramble are, let me give you brief descriptions. The car show is not a judged show but a People's Choice. This means you don't have to get out the toothbrush to clean in the nooks and crannies of your car or vacuum every last crumb from under the seats. You DO need to get it as clean and shiny as possible because we want those that are looking at our cars to be saying "WOW, I wish I had one of those!" In the Funkhana you cannot be shy or worry about what others may think because everyone will be doing the same silly things to entertain everyone else. It is a timed event that challenges you and your partner to cooperate to complete tasks as quickly as possible. The Rallye/Poker Run is definitely a test of one's marriage/relationship. 

The Spring Scramble will be held at Fat Daddy's in Mansfield on Saturday May 4th. Hopefully without the rain this year.

Jack Gandy has once again volunteered to create 2 rallies in one. There will be a Chance Rally imbedded within the Gimmick Rally. Doug McMahan also volunteered to chair the Funkhana and PJ Jackson has volunteered to chair the car show. All the information for the Spring

The No Frills Autocross will be held at Mineral Wells Air Park on June 1st and 2^{nd.} You can make your hotel reservation (Holliday Inn Express Mineral Wells) by going to the CTV web site and clicking on the link. We have a block of 20 rooms. Rooms are the same price as last year, \$85.00 per night. We have the block Friday May 31st thru Sunday June 2nd. 
