### Tech Talk - C-4 Automatic Will Not Shift From Park

After I purchased my 1995 C-4 with an automatic transmission (my wife says I'm shiftless) that I use to autocross I began to notice I was having increasing problems getting the car to shift from park when the car was first started. At times it would take 5 or more minutes pushing the button on top of the shift lever while also pushing the brake before the car would finally shift out of park. Once you got it to shift you would have no additional problems shifting out of park unless the car sat for awhile.

Research on the Internet revealed that the most likely problem was the electric solenoid that is located just to the left of the shift lever under the center console.

To get to the solenoid you must first remove the four 7mm screws that hold on the center console cover and lay the cover aside. Then remove the small piece of carpet and remove the front two screws that hold down the rear of the center console shift cover. There is one more screw located in the bottom of the front cup holder that also must be removed. The shift cover should then be loose and you can lift it from the rear and slide it back enough to remove the wires that operate the rear glass release (on my coupe) and the shift indicator light. By carefully working the shift cover up you should be able to see the solenoid just to the left of the shift lever. Both ends are press on fittings and are easily removed with a blade screwdriver. Disconnect the wires to the solenoid and remove it. Now you just put everything back together in the reverse order. This would be a good time to replace the shift indicator light bulb if it has been failing to light.

I had no luck trying to find a replacement solenoid and my car no longer has problems shifting from park.

Warning and Disclaimer: The car will now shift out of park without having to press the brake and while this worked for me, it may not work for everyone.


#### ANNUAL CRUISER PHOTO CONTEST






