





VICE PRESIDENT REPORT



The new calendar year is rapidly filling with events that will keep us enjoying our Corvettes and club. Since the Awards Banquet was cancelled due to the weather, awards were presented at the January meeting. I would like to congratulate the Outstanding Male and Female Members for 2013, Doug McMahan and Jo Anne Smith. Both of them contribute a lot of time and energy to Cowtown Vettes and we appreciate their hard work.

Turnout for the tour of the Western Currency Facility of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing was far greater than I had anticipated! On Friday, Jan 10th, 33 members and 1 guest met at the facility for the tour in spite of early rains and a brisk wind. It was a fascinating and educational tour showing how the paper currency we use every day is printed. Combining old-world engraving techniques and new computer generated technology, this facility creates MILLIONS of dollars in a matter of minutes. We learned the composition of the special paper used, how plates are made, how laser scanners check for accuracy, and how the bills are printed, cut, and bundled for shipment to the Federal Reserve Bank. It is not considered real money until the Bank releases it for use. Exhibits explained interesting features of the process as well as the special markings on each piece of paper currency. Several members were pulling out bills to discover what each mark meant on their bill. A gift shop offered unique prints and money related items for purchase. Following the tour, 28 members and guests met at BJ's Brewery for drinks, good food, and fellowship. Before leaving, everyone sang "Happy Birthday" to David Gill who celebrated his birthday that day.

The first 100%er event for the year will be the Super Bowl Party starting at 5:00PM on Sunday, Feb 2nd at Pappas Burger on I-30 at Forest Park. It will be held in the back room of the facility with a large television for viewing the game. If you want to participate in the charity 50/50 football pool you need to be there before the game starts at 5:30PM to pick your squares. Food and drinks can be ordered at any time during the game. Come join your Cowtown friends for an afternoon of football, food, and fellowship. Results of the football pool will be announced in next month's newsletter.

The main event and second 100%er for February is the Valentine's Day Dinner on Saturday Feb 15th 6:00PM - 10:00PM. 




