NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM

Many of us are members of the National Corvette Museum (NCM) in Bowling Green, KY, so the recent natural disaster that impacted the Skydome hit home. Additionally, NCCC is a partner with the NCM and I (as Director of Public Relations) manage the NCCC Kiosk Display in the hallway between the main building and the Skydome; only ~30 feet from the edge of the sinkhole.

The NCM received a call at 5:44am on February 12, 2014 from their security company stating that the motion detectors were going off in the Skydome area. Upon arrival and inspection it was discovered that a sinkhole had collapsed inside the Museum Skydome. There wasn't anyone in or around the NCM at the time of the collapse. The Fire Department arrived and secured the area; estimating the size of the hole to be ~40 feet across and ~25-30 feet deep (at the top of the caved in debris). Since that date, an assessment of the Skydome as confirmed that the perimeter is structurally sound. The other Corvettes in the Skydome have been safely removed to allow for continued assessment of the facility and to aid in the facility restoration. Unfortunately the sinkhole took eight collector Corvettes down, as the floor collapsed under them; two were on loan from GM* the other 6 were owned by NCM (some donated by individuals):

In a press conference on Thursday, February 13, GM / Chevrolet announced that they would help the National Corvette Museum recover from the massive sink hole; that Chevrolet will be overseeing restoration of the Corvettes damaged. They stated that the process will be managed by General Motors Design in Warren, Mich. "The vehicles at the National Corvette Museum are some of the most significant in automotive history," said Mark Reuss, executive vice president of General Motors Global Product Development. "There can only be one 1-millionth Corvette ever built. We want to ensure as many of the damaged cars are restored as possible so fans from around the world can enjoy them when the Museum reopens." The restoration will be overseen by Ed Welburn, vice president of GM Global Design. When the cars are recovered, they will be on display

in the museum for a period of time; then they will be shipped to the Mechanical Assembly facility, a small specialty shop within GM Design, where the best restoration approach will be determined. Mechanical Assembly has been part of GM Design since the 1930s, and today maintains and restores many of the vehicles in the GM Heritage Collection and GM's historic concept cars.

Also during the same press conference, Mike Murphy, CEO of Scott, Murphy & Daniel Construction, shared that sinkholes are very common for this area, but that what is not common is for one to swallow eight Corvettes. He stated that it is repairable and the building foundation and structure is in good condition. He stated that it will take 2-3 weeks for them to stabilize and secure the area (the red spire, the walls of the sinkhole); once that has been accomplished, the process of recovering the eight Corvettes will begin. He stated that the vehicle recovery process is anticipated to take 4-6 days after the stabilization. Once the Corvettes are removed, they will replace the earth and floor system.

According to an update from Gary Cochran (NCM) gave us an update on 2/21/14, stating that the NCM building and cars were insured however the remediation to get the whole filled was not, along with a few other incidentals. They were anticipating that the cost of those gaps would be between \$200k and \$1M. They will be doing seismic tests in the rest of the building and property to make sure they don't have other unknowns that could cause issues like this in the future. If you are not a member of the NCM, this would be a great time to join and show your support for their efforts to preserve the history of the American Sports Car – the Corvette.



We would recommend that you visit the National Corvette Museum's website for full authoritative details and information around the sinkhole, the Skydome rebuild, Corvette removal and restoration. Additionally, you can find some videos taken inside the sinkhole using a drone.

- 5. Appears 1974 was one of the few years GM didn't keep quantity records on paint color

TECH TALK

... with Donald Hickman

What is this and why is it sliding around in the door of my C4?



TOTORWORKS

After we began to autocross our 95 C4 Corvette last season it developed a loud banging noise while being driven at the track. With the help of Fred Proctor the offending item was removed from the door before it broke the window glass. The pictured item is the power window spring and it helps the electric motor raise the window. Failure to have the spring in place will cause the motor to fail early requiring a replacement window regulator with motor (approxi-

place will cause the motor to fail early requiring a replacement window regulator with motor (approximately \$280.00 plus shipping). Returning the spring to its proper location required the removal of the door panel. The only trick I found to removing the panel is GM locates 3 screws in the door panel insert that frames the door handle. One screw is visible but a second is located behind the panel light and the third is located behind the manual door lock knob. Failure to remove all 3 will result in a broken insert (\$59.99 plus shipping). The service manual for my Corvette did not list information on installing the power window spring but a phone call to Frank in Mid America Motorworks Tech Department provided the needed information. You install the spring with the window in the up position and once the door panel is off, there is access to the window regulator and the proper location for the spring. Once the spring is installed, you reinstall the door panel.

Warning and Disclaimer: While this worked for me, it may not work for everyone. If you have any questions please give me a call.
