Since we pride ourselves in being Cowtown Vettes it seems only appropriate that we showcase things that are unique to Cowtown (Fort Worth), Texas. If you have never been to the Stockyards you can join us at the Coliseum on Saturday, June 21st to see Pawnee Bill's Wild West Show at 2:30pm. This is not a rodeo but a historical re-enactment of the original Pawnee Bill's Wild West Show that toured the country over 90 years ago and was held in the coliseum in 1909.

The show features trick roping, trick shooting, cowboy songs, and an entertaining look at history. Historical figures such as Pawnee Bill come to life and transport the spectator back in time. The show is based on actual events and stunts that occurred in the original show. This is wholesome entertainment for the entire family that is full of animals, spectacular performers with ropes, pistols, or bullwhips, and even a singing cowboy. Adult tickets are \$15.00, seniors \$11.00, kids 12 and under are \$8.00. Following the show you can watch the famous longhorn cattle drive down the middle of Exchange Street. Since the show starts at 2:30pm please meet at the coliseum entrance no later than 2pm. If you want to come early and explore the shops and restaurants at your leisure feel free to do so or stay after to experience the night life in the Stockyards. Depending on the
