

# **NKF/NCCC 2014 Car Raffle**

NCCC raffles a new Corvette with the proceeds given to the National Kidney Foundation each year. The raffles have been conducted since 1976 and over the years, NCCC has supported Muscular Dystrophy, Spina Bifida of America, and now the National Kidney Foundation. Members of NKF were active supporters of this when the members were raising money for participation in the Transplant Games. That program no longer exists but the funds we donate do assist with the Organ Donor Awareness Program.

Each club who sells one ticket per member (or \$10 per member) is recognized by NKF as a 100% Participation Club. Those clubs who reach that goal are given a certificate in appreciation of their support. Not a big value prize but the satisfaction of knowing that you helped someone else is a wonderful feeling. The amount that each club must earn is based on their membership at the beginning of the calendar year and Cowtown started the year with approximately 130 members. This means that we have to sell \$1300 value in tickets and at this time, we are \$880 short of that goal. We have a lot of work to do to catch up in the next 6-8 weeks. We have achieved the 100% goal for the past 5 years and we don't want to go back now. We have a tradition to uphold as being one of the top clubs in NCCC in our participation and support of the Charity Program.

Unlike the NCM, we do not limit the number of tickets sold as all of the monies go to Charity and GM/Corvette does not sell us a Corvette at cost. However, it is estimated that we sell on average 8-10,000 tickets each year. Not bad odds for these tickets.

So, you have an opportunity to help the club reach this goal by purchasing at least one ticket at the July or August meeting. I will turn in the tickets during the week of convention so you can buy tickets until I leave, August 23. Look for Sylvia Hoaldridge, Glenda McMahan or myself, Debbie Lindsey at the next few meetings and help Debbie Lindsey us support this very worthy charity. WE NEED YOU!! 




