### feature event for today was a tour and tasting at the Blue Bell Creamery in Brenham, TX. As much as I dislike cruising down the interstate, we departed on I-35 and headed south to just north of Waco were we headed down the backroads thru Marlin. After a quick pit stop, we enjoyed some very scenic and fun backroads before coming into Brenham. We treated ourselves like kids today, we toured and ate our Blue Bell Ice Cream before eating a late lite lunch at Must be Heaven. After lunch, several walked around town, shopped, some gathered cruiser points and several headed back to the pool at the hotel. That evening we had a private room reserved at Earnie's All American

Bistro for some great italian food.

We had the pleasure of hosting the Blue Shiner Cruise,

a 4-day, 3-night cruise at the end of July. We departed

Cracker Barrel in Burleson with 17 Corvettes and 33

participants, 7 of which were guests. Our targeted

Friday morning we headed out early again with two feature stops for the day; with another Vette which had driven down to join us. Our first stop was just west of Houston at the Hemi Hideout, yes Mopars! This is a private collection of some unique and special mopars along with tractors, hundreds of neon signs of yesteryear and even a 100 million year old tortoise fossil; believed to be the only one in the world. it started with us dropping our passengers off at the front door, we parked our Vettes and they shuttled the drivers up to the front door via golf cart. We spent a couple of hours here enjoying John's special facility, his collection, not to mention his many stories - check out our website for more details and tons of photos. We departed the Hemi Hideout west and south to Shiner Texas, where we were to enjoy a tour and tasting at the Spotzel Brewery (Shiner beer). However, we headed to the Sunken Gardens (healthy buffet) for lunch so we weren't enjoying beer on an empty stomach ;) The cruise had another 100+ miles scheduled on the back roads however, popular vote won out and we headed back to the hotel in La Grange to enjoy another late afternoon in the pool. Later that evening, we head back to Flatonia (about 25 miles away) to Robert's Steak Housefor dinner setup in a private room.

Saturday we headed out from La Grange over towards San Marcos, where our lodging was for the tonight. Before we went to the hotel, we were setup to tour Dick's Classic Car Garage; an amazing facility with a very amazing collection of automobiles from carriages to the '50s. The collection included a couple of boat tail Auburns, a Tucker and several others most of us had never even heard of, all fully documented. From there, we headed to the hotel to check in, freshen up a bit and head over to the quaint little town of Gruene, TX; along with 7 other members joining us. This time of year is crazy in Gruene with the river rafting however,

several enjoyed shopping in the little shops while others enjoyed live music in the oldest dance hall in Texas. We ate dinner at the Gristmill Restaurant, one of our favorites down in that part of the country. Afterwards, you were on your own to head back to San Marcos to the hotel; many enjoyed another evening in the pool.

Sunday, our only feature was a visit to the Circuit of the Americas (COTA); the only full-time F1 Race Track in the USA; which is only 3 years old this fall. Ever since we enjoyed our first F1 race at this facility back in 2012, my goal was to someday drive our Corvette on this awesome track, even if just parade laps. The deal wasn't fully finalized until the week we departed on the cruise but it did happen :) We arrived at the track and met up with additional Cowtown members and a few members from San Jacinto Corvette Club (Houston) who I had invited to join us; we were now up to 32 Corvettes and one M3. Cameron (tour guide) took us via a double-decker tour bus around the huge facility, with focus stops at turn 11, turn 1 and the grandstands. He gave us a great run down of F1 and the other events that are held there along with lots of facts about the facility. We then proceeded to the Tower, a 251' structure which is the only place you can view the entire 3.5 track which consists of 9 right hand and 11 left hand turns; awesome views. From there we headed back to the main gate where our lap leader, Eric (professional driver & instructor) took us thru tunnel 2 to the garage / pit area. We split up into three groups so the experience would be better for everyone, rather than one large grouping. The track was amazing from the tours to the turns and the tower but nothing (and I mean nothing) can explain the view and the fun we had on these laps around this 3.5 mile track; simply amazing!!! After everyone (both drivers in each car that wanted to drive) enjoyed laps, we headed out as one large group to take a group photo; we managed to get 26 of the Corvettes to join us for the photo. This was the end of the cruise and as you exited tunnel 2, you were on your own to get back home. Be sure to check out the six event pages on our club website for lots more pictures, videos and information. In closing, Glenda and I would like to thank everyone that participated for all four days down to just for Sunday; we had a great time and hope you did as well.

As a follow-up, as part of the agreement to let us enjoy laps, each person will be purchasing a ticket to a return event for 2014, either the SVRA event the 2nd weekend of October or the F1 race the first weekend of November. If you didn't get a chance to join us for the laps, we can probably get you in on the special pricing for either of these return event; contact me.
