

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#### **COWTOWN CRUISER**



I hope you have decided to participate in the 2015 Cowtown Cruiser Program (CCP). Now that you have the tools to get started it's not too late to begin. To maximize your points for each eligible location try

to capture places that have historical markers naming that location or try to get as many out of state locations as possible. Be aware that you must actually be in the location named on the marker to receive credit. If other cities or counties are mentioned in the marker you must go to those locations to receive credit. Out of state locations with historical markers earn the most points.

The best way to photograph cities is to locate the post office. These sites will have the name of the city as well as the state clearly marked on the building. There usually is room to SAFELY park your Corvette and take your photo of you, your car, and the location identifier. When taking the photo it is not necessary to have the entire Corvette in the picture. You do need enough of it to identify it as your Corvette or a Corvette in your group. It cannot be a photo of a Corvette on a trailer.

I am currently in the process of finalizing plans for the Tail of the Lizard Cruise to Mississippi. We will leave early Thursday morning on May 28 and arrive in Natchez, MS that evening. A group dinner is planned at either the Magnolia Grill or The Camp which are down by the river. Friday morning we drive to Monticello to pick up MS Hwy 587 (The Tail of the Lizard) and will drive it North to South. Following lunch at the Dinner Bell in McComb, MS we will return to drive

Hwy 587 from South to North if enough want to switch drivers. Returning to Natchez we will have dinner at Magnolia Hall Plantation (minimum 20 people) consisting of chicken entrée (\$37) or beef en-



trée (\$40). Saturday morning we leave Natchez and drive the Natchez Trace Parkway arriving in Vicksburg, MS with several stops along the Trace. Lunch and dinner are not planned yet. We should arrive in time to tour the battlefield for those that are interested. We leave for home on Sunday morning with an early lunch at Duck Diner in Monroe, LA.

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#### **TECH TALK - with Doug McMahan**

#### How-To Replace Front Spring and Lower the Front of Your C4

#### Tools will need

- Lug Wrench
- Torque Wrench
- Good Floor Jack
- Heavy-Duty Jack Stands
- various wood scraps
- Ball Joint Puller check w/O'Reilly's if you don't have one
- Pry Bar or Large Screwdriver
- Rags / Paper Towels
- Brake Part Cleaning Fluid
- Needle Nose Pliers
- Metric & US Socket Set Impact Wrench is helpful
- Some say Weather-strip Cement I preferred Marine Epoxy
- Utility Knife an/or Dremel (for removing spring pivots)
- Duct Tape
- Hacksaw with Coarse Blade
- Two-Part Marine Epoxy
- Complete C4 Lowering Kit (12 pieces)
- <u>Front Spring Retainer / Mount Upgrade</u> (only needed for 84-87 Corvettes)

The Front Procedure will take between 3 and 4 hours to complete; depending on the adhesive and drying time.

Your C4 will need to be lifted in stages to get it high enough for this procedure. But before we start jacking, a few common sense items; place the car in park and set the parking brake. For safety we block the rear tires. I installed a front spring which is stiffer than the base factory spring, therefore it is less curved; requiring the C4 had to be jacked higher. Before you start lifting the C4, break the front lug nuts loose. I personally would open the hood since it will be more difficult once the car up on stands.

Start by placing a 1x4 piece of wood on your floor jack pad (to protect the spring channel), centering the jack with the frame. When you have almost reached your jack's maximum lift, set the jack stands in place. I typically locate them inboard of the factory jacking points, where the folded metal frame curves inward away from the rocker panel. Be sure to avoid kinking the nearby brake lines, parking brake cable, and fuel lines. Lower the car onto the jack stands, add a 4x4 or extra 2x4s onto the floor jack so you can raise your C4 up higher, then raise the jack stands and set the C4 back down on them. If you don't have tall enough jack stands, you can place them on wide-sturdy wood blocks to obtain the necessary height. Go ahead and remove both wheels once you have the C4 in the air

Now for the really dirty work; start by disconnecting the sway bar from the lower control arm on both sides and rotate it up and out of the way; if you remove the connector bracket you don't even have loosen all those brackets to rotate it. On later model C4's with ABS, go ahead and unbolt the sensor at this time.



Place your floor jack under the lower control arm, parallel to the spring so we can start removing the suspension; not perpendicular as show in the photo to the left. Note that there is Zerk grease fitting on the lower ball joint on the lower control arm. I would suggest using another piece of wood to protect the soft aluminum control arm. Raise the jack until the shock begins to move; then unbolt it using a 13mm socket. I removed the cotter pin and metric castle nut from both the steering tie rod and the upper ball joint using a 21mm socket. Use the ball joint puller to remove the steering tie rod and upper ball joint. Swing the knuckle assembly out of the way and support it. Be sure to watch your brake lines, making sure you aren't damaging them; they typically are NOT long enough to extend all the way down.

Next, lower the floor jack slowly because the spring still holds a massive amount of stored energy. If the jack isn't placed parallel to the spring, it will side load the jack as it lowers, potentially damaging the jack while toppling it over and/or spitting the jack out at you – and

DON'T GET IN A HURRY! When you have lowered your jack all the

way down, the spring should then be unloaded. You may need a prying tool to pop the end of the spring out of the control arm. Now, repeat all this on the other side.

Next, remove the metric spring retainer nuts with a 15mm socket; 2 on each side. The bolt may spin, and it's virtually impossible to get to it. This is where an impact wrench would come in handy or small hands to reach up and hold the top of the bolt. Set the retainers aside as they may need to be modified; discussed later. If performing this on the earlier Corvettes, they have 1/4" thick aluminum spacer plate that will come out with the spring. These should be discarded

for the maximum lowering effect. Next, remove the spring protectors with a ½" socket which will help in getting the springs out – there are 4 bolts on each one.



Before attempting to slide the spring out, cover the ball joints with some old rags, old socks or something. This is because you will have to really wrestle the spring out of the frame. Try working it back and forth, and twisting it a little at the same time. If all else fails, you can remove one of the lower control arms. The old rubber might even fall out.





Now for the new spring work which had performed prior to taking the C4 apart. If you are only lowering your C4, then the following steps have to be done after disassembly. To lower it, it will be necessary to cut the rubber down to the surface of the spring. Since I already had the longer rear bolts for our C4 to

lower it, I opted to cut down the stock rubber/steel perches by cutting them off the spring. This also allowed me to retain the steel top



plate for better and firmer spring positioning. I started with the hacksaw close to the spring; after wrapping the spring with duct tape for protection. You will get your work-out cutting the rubber and make sure your blade is tight or it won't be a smooth cut. The spring is composite and any damage will weaken it and expose the fibers to water and debris. Now to finish removing the rubber from the spring and surfacing the part that was going to be re-used. My choice was to use a slow belt sander with 50-grit belt which cut the rubber nicely however; again, be careful not to gouge the spring. I also used the belt sander to level out the cut-off side of the rubber perch so that it would have a good level surface to glue back to the spring.

Regardless which way you go here, you will need to either glue the new spring wedges or in my case the trimmed factory rubber back to the spring. They recommended using the 3M weather-strip cement however after reading some war stories, I opted to use two-part marine epoxy.

Tape or clamp the rubber perches (or factory trimmed plates) to the spring to ensure proper adhesion and let set. Waiting for the adhesive to dry is the longest part of the installation; if you didn't pre-build your lowered spring why not clean up all those nice aluminum suspension pieces while you wait. It would be a good time to paint your rotor caps and calipers if you'd like. I went ahead and changed out the ball joints while I was this far; then lubricated all the bushings.



Since the aftermarket wedges are lower profile than the factory pivots, the spring will be located closer to the top of the spring channel, which is the load carrying surface. The difference in height is approximately 1/2 inch (including the aluminum spacer plate.) When using Mid America's wedges, they do recommend swapping out the stamped steel spring retainers (early C4s) for the late-model aluminum styles ones. The Mid America part number is 602714, and they retail for \$69.99 as of this writing. If you do not upgrade the brackets the spring will move around and will tear the wedges loose and destroy them. If you don't want to purchase the upgrade brackets, you can trim the steel ones to the proper height.


Finally ready to get this spring installed, so you start by inserting it back into the frame channel with the rubber perches still taped up, to prevent them from coming dislodged (especially if you don't wait for total cure time). Once in place,

you can push the spring out slightly to either side enough to remove the tape.

There are depressions in the load bearing surface of the frame where the wedges seat against; make sure you position the wedges in this depression. Some may ask, "wouldn't it be lower if there were no wedges at all?" however, it is essential that wedges be at least 1/4" tall. If not, the spring will be in contact the metal frame which will cause damage to the spring which will alter the spring rate and the spring's designed function and purpose. The pivot points of the spring are essential in establishing the spring rate, and their location determines the spring's anti-sway ability.

The remaining assembly is simply the reverse of disassembly – have fun!

Admission prices are \$10 for adults, \$8 for seniors, \$5 for youths 6-16 and Free under 6 years old. Active Military and up to 10 of their guests are also free. In addition, as members of Cowtown Vettes, you can get a free admission ticket. The museum gives us 6 free tickets per year; so call or email me if you're going to Bowling Green.

They have various events each year as well as ongoing programs such as Museum Delivery of your new Corvette. They also hold raffles throughout the year, and you may be next to win a brand new Corvette; so take a chance! You can also take a tour of the GM Corvette Assembly Plant or even a VIP tour for a bit more money. I didn't have time for an Assembly Plant tour last year, so that is definitely

on my wish list. Of course, a tour of NCM itself is well worth the trip to Bowling Green to see the fascinating history of the car we all love so much. There are various benefits to membership including free admission, a subscription to "America's Sports Car" magazine, 10% discount at the museum store, a nifty membership pin, and other benefits' including the knowledge that you are helping to support the preservation and educational efforts that keep "our" car alive.

#### **GOVERNOR'S THOUGHTS**



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
