




gram. You will probably drive to enough qualifying locations over the next few months so take your logo sheet and point sheet with you and take those photographs! Cruiser shirts have been ordered and will hopefully be ready to pick up at the April meeting.

One frequently asked question is "What if I can't get close enough to the sign or monument to photograph it with me and my Corvette?" The best solution is to take the photograph as close as you safely can with you, your logo sheet, your Corvette, and the sign/monument showing in the background. You can then walk to the sign/ monument and take a close-up photo of you, your logo sheet, and the sign/monument. If the inscription is not readable you will need to take a close-up of just the sign or monument inscription to clearly confirm the site. This works well for county courthouses that often have multiple monuments on the grounds.

Since most state/national parks or monuments charge an entrance fee, you do NOT have to actually enter the park/monument to receive credit for that location. Taking your photo at the entrance sign is all you need to verify you were at the location.

Plans are now complete for the Tail of the Lizard Cruise to Mississippi on May 28th to May 31st. Fifteen cars have registered to go but if you think you might want to join us I can add you to a waiting list in case a cancellation occurs. We will be driving the scenic roads around the Natchez area and enjoying Southern comfort food, good seafood, and a little Cajun cuisine. Saturday's drive will take us along the Natchez Trace Parkway to Vicksburg arriving in time


Don't forget about Matching Gift Programs. Does your employer have one? This is a great way to double your money for this great cause.

Hello, fellow Corvette enthusiasts, and welcome to Spring! I know that, like me, ya'll have been waiting for some sunny weather to get "on the road again", like Willie Nelson said in his song of that name. We've had more rain in North Texas than we've had in a while; which is a good

thing. My friends from down the road a piece tell me that Lake Weatherford is back up to the boat ramp once again. So now we can get out in our Vettes and enjoy some dry roads and clear skies.

Perhaps you might like to enjoy the scenery on the way to the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky. In case you've forgotten; it's right near exit 28 off of I-65. There's lots to see and do at the Museum, Corvette Factory, and the local community. While you're there at the museum; you could order yourself a build sheet or reproduction window sticker for your 1981 and later Corvette. Or you could order one right from their website at www. corvettemuseum.org like I did.

Perhaps, like me, you'd like to know just what in tarnation is a build sheet. Well, as I found out from the museum website, it is the piece of paper that travels down the build line with the car. It details everything that goes into making that particular vehicle. As a bit of trivia, before 2006 the date on the build sheet was the order date for that car's production. Seven to ten working days later that particular Corvette would roll off the production line.

Except for a few 1982 cars whose information was lost, every car since 1981 has a build sheet and window sticker available through the museum. If you would like one for your "sweet baby"; they cost \$35.00 for museum members or \$45.00 if you're not a member and lamination is \$5.00 more. A window sticker and build sheet will cost \$75.00 for members and \$90.00 for non-members; so why not become a member and save yourself a few greenbacks. If you'd like to see what they look like in person, well, you're in luck; because last month I ordered a window sticker/ build sheet combo for my 1995 Coupe. I added lamination for them both; so my total cost as a member was \$85.00. If I was not a member; I would have had to shell out \$100.00 of my hard earned retirement pennies. I will have them at the May 1st membership meeting of our Cowtown Vettes for you to peruse at your leisure.

As always, your questions or comments are welcome. See me at the membership meeting or contact me by phone or on the web. I often have raffle tickets for a new Corvette, such as the Arctic White 2015 Convertible that will be drawn on April 25, 2015. 
