I would like to remind everyone again that the deadline for submitting your Cowtown Cruiser Program point's sheet is November 7th and photos must be submitted by Sunday, November 15th. Even with these deadlines fast approaching it's still not too late to accumulate enough points to receive an award for 2015. Donald and I took a short 3 day cruise to Canyon Lake, Texas and managed to pick up 34 points with very few stops. We made the best of our stops by using only county seats. The courthouses had historical markers that mentioned both the county and the city which gave 2 points for each (4 points total). The courthouse grounds had at least one war memorial with added points to that one stop. Since older, historical churches were usually built in the downtown areas near the courthouse, it was easy to spot the steeples and find the church within a block or two of the courthouse. See how easy it is to get those points?

If you are new to the Cruiser Program I hope you took the time to look at the cruiser books brought by past participants at the last meeting. A couple CAN use just one book for each member but there must be a separate photo of each member at the site or one photo of both members at the same site in order for each member to receive points for that site. Since your photo book will have sections for each category on the point's sheet you must have a photo of the site in each section to receive points for each category shown in the photo. For example, to use the historical marker at the Blanco County courthouse for both the county and the city of Johnson City there must be a photo of that marker with you, the cruiser logo, and your Corvette in the county section and city section of your book. Please contact me if you have any questions.

I am currently working on a 3 day cruise to follow Route 66 from Oklahoma City to Tulsa. I will have dates and more details at the September meeting. We would leave on a Friday morning and return on Sunday. Potential stops include the Oklahoma National Memorial & Museum, the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum, Pops



drive-in and the Round Barn in Arcadia, the Route 66 Interpretive Center, and McJerry's Route 66 Gallery.

Gwynne Horton is helping to coordinate a cruise to the Red River Army Depot in northeast Texas. If you have not already signed up to go, you will need to do so at the September meeting so she can reserve the cabins. This will be a 3 day cruise leaving on a Friday morning with lunch and a stop at a candy factory on the way up. This puts us arriving at the army base around 3pm in time to check in, make beds, and make plans for dinner. Saturday would include a visit to the Tex-Ark Antique Auto Museum or a tour of the Ace of Clubs which is an historic home with ties to gambling. Dinner that night will be an old-fashioned hot dog cookout over a campfire. Sunday's drive home will be at your own pace. There are several interesting stops along the way for those collecting cruiser points. As with the last "pajama party", what happens at the RRAD stays at the RRAD!!!

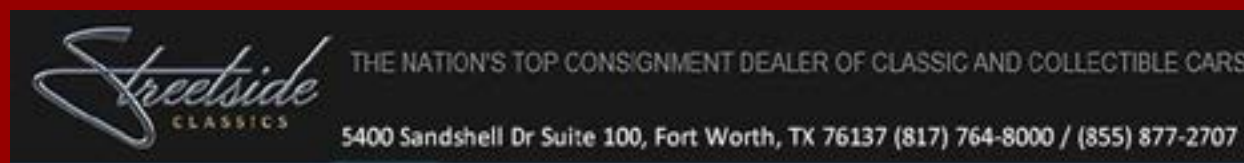

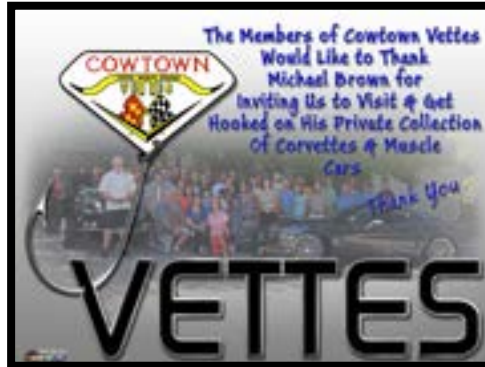

Nothing from James this month, so here are a few additional random pictures from recent events.....



Well, as you have all heard, CTV's last NCCC Event for 2015 has been a complicated one. Short version: the TMS contract

the Red Bull Air Races, granted them total access 10-days before and after their event which pushed us out on our September 19th & 20th date. Some have asked what about our contract; well, we were asking and waiting on that when we were finally told we didn't have September this year. After over a week of discussions with TMS along with seeking other facilities to us for this event, we finally settled for the only available TMS date of November 21st & 22nd – only for this year. It won't be as hot and we are the last NCCC event in the Southwest Region; we aren't the last NCCC event across the country. Since we were already talking 2016 dates with TMS, timing was good because they get filed at the SWR Governor's Meeting on September 19th. TMS wanted to push our event into October; along with the Annual Corvette Show which is not doable. So we have decided to flip-flop the TMS event and the joint NCCC Event we host with CCT; putting our 20th Annual Super Speedway Weekend on April 23rd & 24th of next year. We have started working and are awaiting the contracts for both years at this time.

Back to this year, on November 21st & 22nd, Cowtown will host our [19th Annual Super Speedway Weekend](#) at Texas Motor Speedway. It is the largest single event and the largest revenue generating event that Cowtown hosts each year; so please mark these new event dates on your Calendar. We start on Friday afternoon around 4pm with setup, tech, hospitality, etc. with autocrossing taking place on Saturday and Sunday. We do provide a catered dinner with Fastest Time of the Day (FTD) awards on Saturday evening at the host hotel, along with the NKF Charity event. We would also invite you to participate in the event – remember, it is you against the clock and on a surface better than most city streets; you can drive as fast or slow as you want. If

you have never autocrossed in NCCC, you can run 10 of the events as a “novice” participant; while you learn all about enjoying your Vette. Feel free to contact me or other competitors in the club for any questions you might have.

We do have our functional chairperson positions filled and we thank everyone that stepped up for those. We still need volunteers to work several areas at the event; so please get involved and help Cowtown to be successful by hosting another great event. On the [Event Information](#) page on our website there is a section labeled “[Functional Descriptions](#)” located under Worker Signup. We would invite you to take a look at that; it explains (at a high-level) what each functional work area does. We will also have worker signup sheets at each membership meeting. If you prefer, you can click the link on CTV's website to RSVP as a worker via email.

You can visit the links embedded here in this article or on our club website to see event photos from previous years. We look forward to your assistance to enable Cowtown to host these events to be the best in the region – we need you and your skills and expertise!

Several of you realized the issues we had with the event timing and printer system at the Mineral Wells and Practice Autocross events this year. Since that time, we have spent exhausting efforts to finally get these resolved. This was something that had to be resolved for us to host the TMS event with the quality our participants have come to expect from us.
