

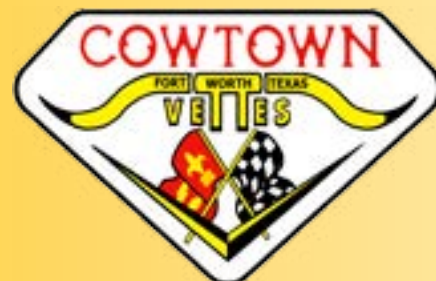

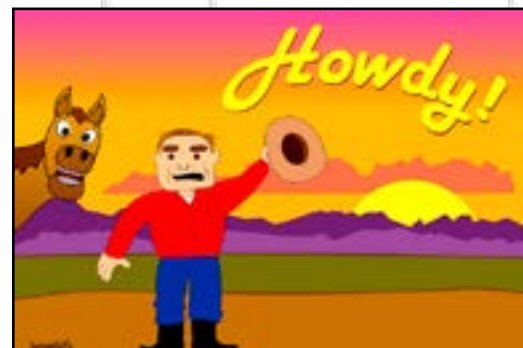

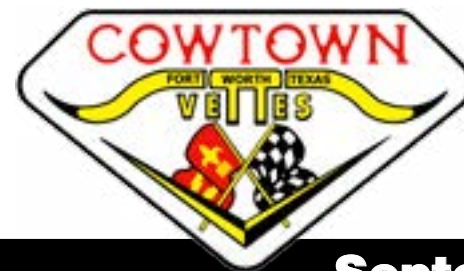

Stay tuned for the total amount of pounds of food donated. I think it will surpass last year's donation!

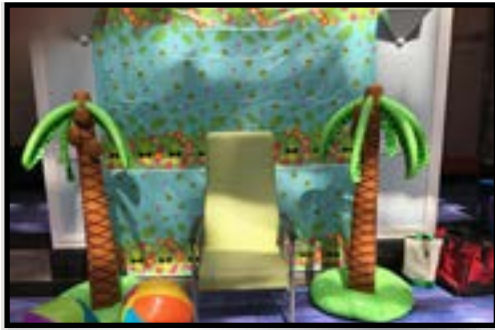

I hope everyone who attended the convention was able to visit the National Corvette Museum while in Bowling Green. If you were inspired while visiting the museum I suggest that becoming a member is a nice way to ensure the future of the museum and also enjoy some cool benefits.

You may or may not be aware of it, but every year the National Corvette Museum inducts a few people to the Corvette Hall of Fame. These can be GM employees (I.E. engineers, designers, marketers, etc.), Corvette Dealers, Corvette enthusiasts, racers, tuners, or anyone else who has made a significant contribution to the Corvette world. The induction of the new members to the Corvette Hall of Fame is conducted in conjunction with the annual NCM Anniversary celebration that is held the weekend before Labor Day.

One of this year's inductees is Peter Brock. In 1959 Peter was the youngest designer that worked at General Motors at the time at 19 and for that matter since. Peter, Bill Mitchell, who was the GM vice president of styling and Larry Shinoda were assigned to design a concept car based on the "stillborn racing project" 1957 Corvette SS. Another concept car, so what is the big deal? Well, this particular concept car became the influence and inspiration for the design of the upcoming C2 model. Here is the weird part; the project was not funded by the General, but instead was privately funded. Peter later became a great figure in the world of motorsports.

Another of this year's inductees is a gentleman named Jim Minneker. Jim was a racer and an engineer who had a unique understanding of what makes power and what it takes to control that power on the track. Jim joined the Corvette team in 1986 and spent the next 10 years working on the LT1, LT4, and the legendary LT5 engines that would become the heart of the XR1 Corvette supercar. He later became the engineering manager for GM High Performance Vehicle Operations.

As a racer, Jim competed in the SCCA World Challenge, the IMSA Supercar series, IMSA GT and the Grand Am series. He was also a member of the team of eight drivers that set the 24-Hour Speed Endurance World Record Run in 1990, driving a stock ZR-1 Corvette at an average speed of 175.885 mph. Jim was also involved in assisting the National Corvette Museum when it was first opening, arranging for displays relating to powertrain and engineering. He was ultimately elected as Chairman of the Board of the NCM where he was instrumental in setting the course for a bright future.

The final 2017 inductee to the NCM Corvette Hall of Fame is a Corvette racer named Tommy Morrison. In the early 1980s, he partnered with Jim Cook to form Morrison-Cook Motorsports. He was credited with dominating showroom stock racing. He set out to prove that Mobil 1 and Corvette were a nearly unbeatable combination racking up more 24-hour endurance wins than any team before them—thus starting a sponsorship relationship that is still winning to this day. Jim also provided race test data to GM an engineer that was invaluable in the design of new models. His wins on the track were also instrumental in establishing Corvette as a high performance icon. So important was this achievement that the National Corvette Museum has a long-term exhibit on display with the actual record run car, and plaster casts of Tommy, Jim Minneker and John Heinricy surrounding it.

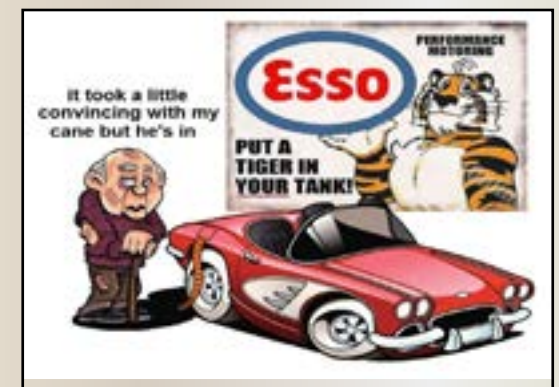

September here already! Before long we will be talking about the end of the year! Renewals will start Oct. 1st so come prepared to renew with this great club! ...renewal form with details is on our website.

Convention will be over by the time you read this! I am sure it was a lot of fun and excitement! Cowtown Vettes had several couples that went. Ask one of them how much fun they had. Next year, we will all want to attend the 2018 NCCC Convention, it will be put on by Tin Hall Toys of the Southwest Region; with help from others in the region. We will want to support them in this big undertaking. The date is July 15-20 in New Orleans, LA.

Several things going on in September in the Southwest Region. Sept. 2-3 is 14 low speed events in Mineral Wells by Tejas Vettes. Sept. 17 (Sunday only) is Longhorn Corvette Club's event at Little River for a people's choice car show and a matching times record and ET drags. Then to finish up the month (9/30-10/1) will be 14 low speed events in Edmond, OK. We will also have a governor's meeting that we will bid on our 2018 events.

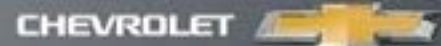

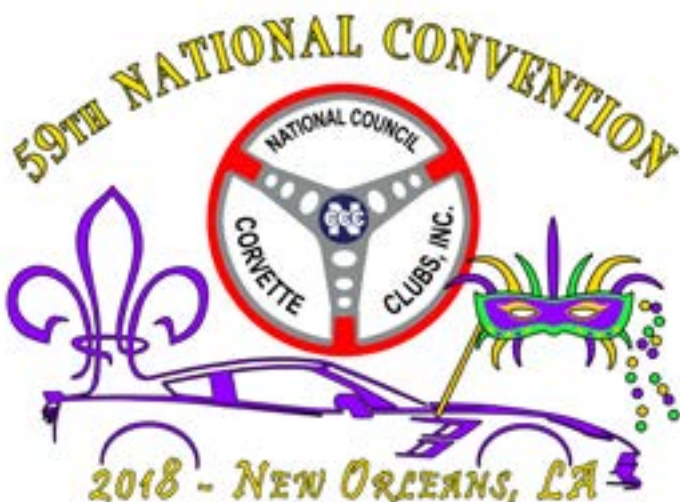
