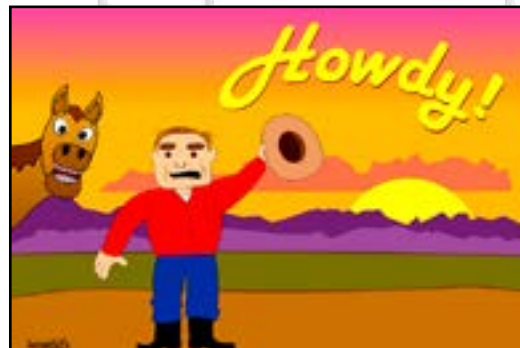

COWTOWN CRUISER

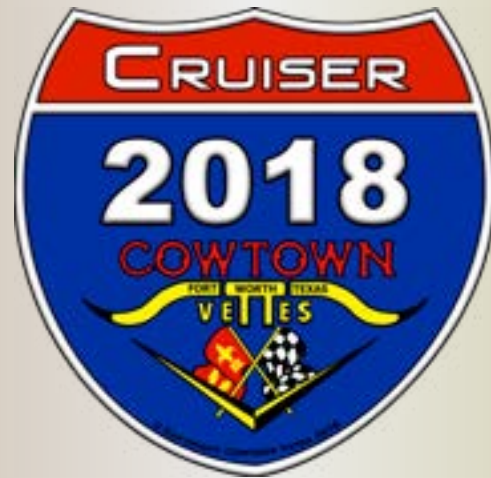


Each month when it is time to sit down and write our article I look back over the articles from the previous 2 years that I have written....partly for inspiration and partly so I don't repeat myself too much...however some things bear repeating....

The word Corvette is synonymous with fun, whether it be cruising down the highway or speeding around the racetrack, but since this article is supposed to be about cruising we will leave the racing to another time! As stated in previous articles, the point of the cruiser program is to encourage our members to get out and drive their cars. Even if you only cruise around our area there is still so much to see....and so many cruiser points to be had. It still isn't too late to chase those cruiser points. Remember the things that need to be included in your photos are: 1) an identifiable portion of your Corvette 2) you 3) the Cruiser logo sign 4) an identifier of your location...ie city sign, county sign, historical marker. In order to read the text on an historical marker it can be beneficial to take a close up photo of the marker. Including the historical marker or being out of state gives you an extra point in some categories. You can refer to the cruiser log for point totals allowed per category. If you have questions about any of the cruiser requirements or rules please do not hesitate to ask.

There have been some questions about the total of points in the Historic Churches category....the extra point for a historical marker does not apply in regard to historical churches...in order to be considered a historical church there needs to be a marker of some type whether it be a state or national historical marker or a marker granted by the church denomination designating historical significance. Hence, the total points that can be obtained for that category is 28...1 point for the church with marker and an extra point if the church is from out of state. Hope that clarifies any confusion there might have been.

The only local cruise currently in the planning stages is a trip to Cranfill's Gap for lunch at the Horny Toad Cafe....yes, another biker bar...this will either take place in August or possibly later in the year when it gets a bit cooler....the early (when does it have to hit 100 degrees in May) and excessive heat we are hav-



ing does not make cruising as pleasant as it could be and definitely not if you want the top off!

If you are interested in planning a cruise, whether it be a few hours, a day, or a week let us know and we will get it on the schedule for you. Not too soon to be thinking about next year and some of the great suggestions for the Corvette Museum happenings that Larry Dyer told us about at the last meeting. Also, Cowtown will be celebrating its 45th Anniversary next year and maybe someone would like to plan a cruise to commemorate that. It doesn't have to be a totally new cruise either....personally I would love to repeat the Tale of the Lizard (from 2015) or get to do the Tale of the Dragon (from 2013)... Of course, just a day trip up and down a curvy road and a stop at a good place to eat can be just as fun.

As always, remember to be on the look out for a unique setting in which to photograph your Corvette for the "What I Saw Along the Way" photo contest. Each person is allowed to enter 3 photos (4 x 6) in this contest with the club voting on them in November. You do not have to participate in the cruiser program to participate in this contest. I know there are some great photographers in this club with some beautiful Corvettes. Looking forward to seeing your photographs.

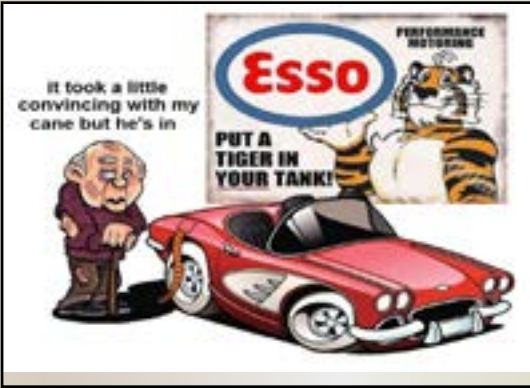
