

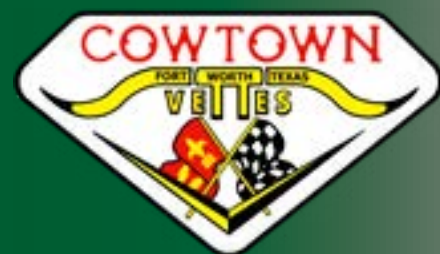

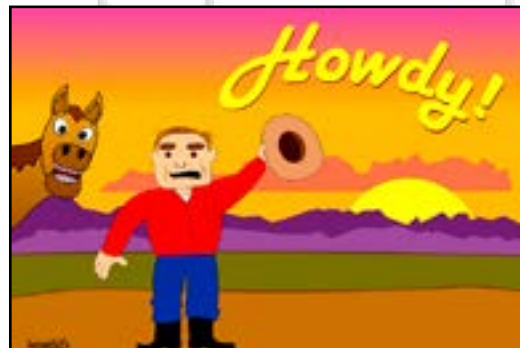

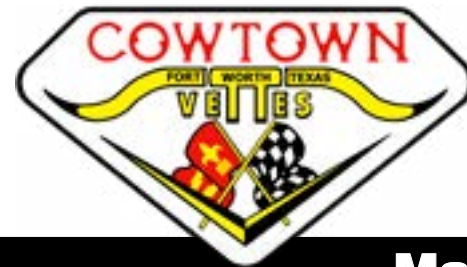

Yes, we can still have winter weather in March, even in Texas, but hopefully we can look forward to more warm weather and beautiful days fit for cruising than winter weather. The return to Daylight Savings Time on March 10 will give that extra hour of daylight each day, too.

Hopefully you have printed off your cruiser logo and log sheet and have already started collecting those cruiser points. Did you know that club socials and NCCC events are great places to add up cruiser points? Just remember to get a picture of you, your car, the logo sheet and the event location. We normally have at least one function per month that would count and some times maybe more...coming up in March is the practice autocross, the Centex Club autocross in Waco, the Vintage Grill and Museum Trip to Weatherford and the Return to the Dogwood Trails Funkana/Car Show/Ralleys in Palestine, Texas.

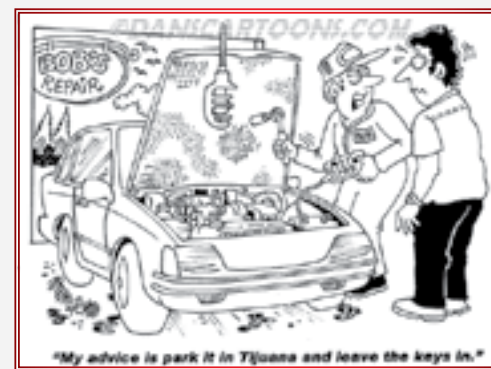
I am sure that there are other states with similar information opportunities.

The attached pages depict changes to the ByLaws of Cowtown Vettes which will be presented to the membership for discussion and consideration for approval at the March membership meeting. The first 2 pages are recommended changes necessary to bring the ByLaws into agreement with recently approved changes to the Standing Rules.

The last page is a recommended change to give clarification for rescheduling regular membership meetings, should an emergency require such.

CHANGES TO BRING BYLAWS INTO SYNC WITH RECENTLY APPROVED STANDING RULES CHANGES:

ELIMINATION OF ANNUAL CHARITY AWARD (REVIEWED WITH CTV BOARD)

**ARTICLE VII**

3.2 CHARITIES

This committee shall be responsible for coordinating all charity activities, including the 50/50 Raffles, within the Club. ~~This committee shall also be responsible for determining the recipient of the Charity Award, its acquisition and presentation, as directed by the Board, at a Club Awards Ceremony.~~ The chairman of this committee ... ..

CHANGES NECESSARY TO BRING BYLAWS INTO SYNC WITH RECENTLY APPROVED STANDING RULES CHANGES:

ADOPTION OF “MEMBERSHIP INVOLVEMENT AWARD” PROGRAM (REVIEWED WITH CTV BOARD)

**ARTICLE VI**

**2.0 DUTIES OF THE VICE PRESIDENT**

In the absence, death, resignation, or inability of the President to perform his/her duties, the duties usually pertaining to the office will be performed by the Vice President until such time as a new President is elected. The Vice President will serve as Chairperson of the Social Committee. ~~The Vice President is responsible for disbursement of the ballots and purchasing of awards for Outstanding Male and Female member of the Club for that year. The Immediate Past President or member designated by the President shall accept and count all Outstanding Male and Female member ballots.~~

**ARTICLE VII**

3.7 MEMBERSHIP/WELCOME (cont’d)

This committee shall be responsible for promotion, notification of eligibility, accurate record keeping and the purchasing and presentation of awards for the ~~100%er~~ **Membership Involvement Award** and the Rookie of the Year Award, as outlined in the Standing Rules, Policies & Procedures). A list of members eligible for the Rookie of the Year Award will be printed in the December newsletter.

3.13 SOCIAL

This committee shall be responsible for coordinating at least, but not limited to, one (1) ~~100%er~~ social event per month from February thru November.



OTHER RECOMMENDED CHANGES (REVIEWED WITH CTV BOARD)

ARTICLE III

2.0 MONTHLY MEMBERSHIP MEETING

Regular monthly meetings will be held on the first Friday of each month at 7:30 p.m. or, in the event of the unavailability of a suitable location ~~72 hours prior to a regularly scheduled meeting~~, at a day and time when suitable facilities can be secured. Notification of such change will be provided to the membership by email and posted on the website ~~immediately after successful rescheduling of the regular meeting prior to the regularly scheduled meeting or of the newly scheduled meeting, whichever is earlier~~. In the event of a conflict between the regular monthly meeting and any other event or activity, the date and/or location of the regular monthly meeting may be changed by a majority of the membership present at any other scheduled monthly membership meeting prior to the month of the change, except in the case of an emergency.

Emergencies may arise due to issues such as the Club's meeting facility being unavailable, ~~inclement weather~~, and/or unavailability of a majority of the Elected Officers ~~which make it necessary to cancel or reschedule the regular monthly meeting(s)~~. ~~Within 48 hours prior to the meeting, the President or designee can determine if the meeting needs to be rescheduled. Members would be notified by email and the change would be posted on the Club's website within 48 hours.~~ Members will be notified by email and the change will be posted on the Club's website immediately upon the determination by the President or designee that canceling or rescheduling of the meeting(s) is necessary.

4.0 SPECIAL MEETINGS

"... .. special meetings of the members of the Club may be called by the President ... .."

When necessary for expediency and to provide for proper documentation, electronic voting via email of the Elected Officers may be utilized by the Board for a special meeting. The business reason for the special meeting of the Board must be clearly stated and a quorum of responses (two-thirds) signifying either "YEA" ~~or~~ "NAY" ~~or~~ "ABSTAIN" must be received.

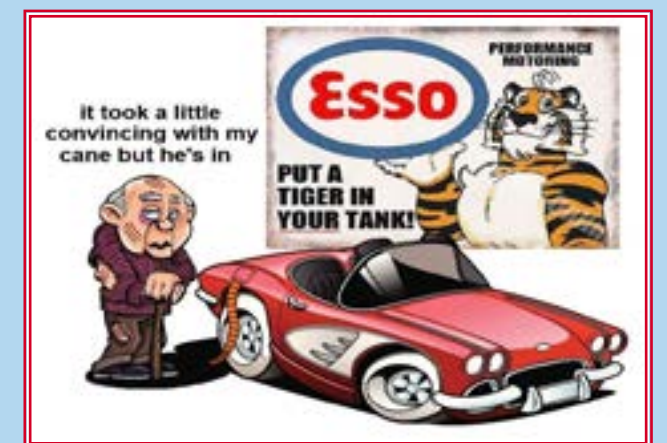
